**A Baby's Helping Hand, Inc.** 1580 Peachtree St. NW, Atlanta, GA 30309

A Baby's Helping Hand provides a bag full of necessities through our Gifts & Giggles program with baby outfits, blankets, diapers and wipes, etc. to mothers in need as they leave the hos-

pital with their newborn. A *Baby's Helping Hand* will deliver gift bags to families through its partnerships with local hospitals and other social services organizations.

QGSC Coordinator: Barb Moyle

QGSC plans to make baby quilts. They should be no smaller than 36x36 and no larger than 48X48, not necessary to be square. (example: 36X48)

### **Quilts of Valor**

QOV QOV Cuilting to Homor & Comfort Coordinator for fabric kits: Wanda Huderski

Presentation coordinator: Wilma Johnson

- Our plan is to identify WW2 and Korean War veterans
  - If you are aware one of these veterans who has not been honored with a QOV please contact Wanda
- Each quilt will include a pillowcase
- Quilt sizes: Minimum: 55" x 65" through Maximum: 72" x 90" and the most common size is 60" x 80"
- Fabric and pattern choices: Fabric used should be high quality 100% "shirt-weight" or "quilt-weight" cotton fabric appropriate for adults. While Quilts of Valor do not have to be red, white, and blue, most recipients, given a choice, choose quilts that are patriotic in theme. Patterns and blocks can be of any design suitable for a patriotic theme.
- Use of military-branch-specific fabrics (Army, Navy, etc.) or non-"patriotic" fabric (overly floral), unless the recipient is known in advance, may create difficulty in identifying a recipient.
- We will register the quilts on QOV website.

### Wellspring -- https://wellspringliving.org/girls/

Wellspring is a 13-month resident program for girl victims between 12-17 who have been rescued from sex trafficking and also has a second 13-month program in a fulltime residence for girls between 18-21 post foster care.

Our goal is to make feminine throws for the girls and young women. Our quilts should be 48" x 60" or larger.

We are not focusing on twin sized quilts this year because we believe it will be easier to have members quilt the smaller quilts without relying on our shrinking group of longarm quilters. A few have already been turned in and they will be donated to Promise Place (A center for helping battered Women and their children.)

Awards ceremony is during Opening Reception 8/2/20 from noon - 4 p.m. at South Fulton Arts Center .

### Call for Entries for "Flight" Exhibit at Aviation Community Cultural Center

We are excited to announce that this year, we will have an additional exhibit at the Aviation Community Cultural Center, located at 3900 Aviation Circle, Atlanta, GA.
