### **Future of Guild Raffle Quilt**

At April's guild board meeting, we will discuss the future of the guild raffle quilt as an annual activity. I've had quite a few people contact me this past week after seeing the beautiful East Cobb Quilters Guild raffle quilt, asking if we could do something similar to what they are doing: exhibiting it at the SQTM, selling tickets virtually, etc.

At the heart of it is that there hasn't been any interest from anyone to chair the committee to do the work of organizing it and selling the tickets. I understand why. It can be a lot of work: finding venues to sell tickets, hauling the quilt around, making sure that there are volunteers manning a table to sell, having a cash box with change, turning the money in to the Treasurer, etc.

ECQG seems to have eliminated some of that but it still boils down to still needing a guild volunteer to set up a virtual store, do the accounting, ensure that all internet protocols are there for safety, security and transparency.

That being said, the \$10 per member ticket allotment represents \$1000 of our annual income so there needs to be careful thought put into how we might ensure that we have funds to cover programs and other guild expenses.

And, I do think we all enjoy the group process of making the raffle quilt, the excitement of the unveiling and the image of what the quilt represents to us as a group.

So, I'm not suggesting that we will never do another raffle quilt. Perhaps we could have the fun and excitement of making a group quilt but then donate it to a non-profit community organization for them to raffle off, place in a silent auction, or hang in their offices. Maybe that change would encourage someone to volunteer to chair the committee.

### MEET A MEMBER - JOAN WILLCOCKS

You probably know Joan Willcocks for the AMAZING ribbons she makes each year for the winners of the Guild's annual Challenge guilt, but there is more to this 16-year member of QGSC and Air National Guard veteran. Joan took time away from renovating her "new" home in PTC to fill us in on her quilting journey.

Like many of us, Joan learned to sew in order to make her own clothes - this is "back in the day" when we wore only dresses to school! She started quilting in 1983 when a few of her coworkers decided to learn to guilt using a "Quilt In A Day" pattern. After mastering the use of the rotary cutter, Joan never looked back, and continued to quilt from then on. By the way, Joan resurrected that first quilt, took it apart, added some coordinating fabric, guilted (it had been tied) and bound it. She donated it to Community Service a few years ago. She joined her first guild in 1991 when she realized, "You don't have to be good to join a guild, just curious".

Joan is a self-described "technique junkie". She likes to add dimension to guilts using folded fabric, yo-yo's, prairie points and the like. We have seen her apply embellishments to quilts, including beads, buttons, braids and trims. Her favorite block is a log cabin (the pattern of her first quilt) as it is so versatile. Currently, she is part of a small group creating experimental art quilts.

Joan has always been generous with her time. talent and stash - so it is no surprise that she donated our 2021 Raffle Quilt. See Page 6. The quilt was originally called "Fifty Something" because it was started when she was 50 and it contains over 50 different fabrics. Joan renamed it "Pinwheel Garden" as it is based on the double pinwheel block by Jean Wells. Comprised of greens, blues and light neutrals, the guilt has an inner border where the edge of queen bed would be, upon which Joan has added dimensional applique.

Next time we all get together, seek out Joan to say "Hi!" You may, or may not, recognize her from her self-styled avatar at right.
