## CO-PRESIDENTS' MESSAGE — KRISTIN SLAGLE

### **QGSC FRIENDSHIP GROUPS**

It seems our guild has gotten away from facilitating the forming of friendship or small groups and I think that's something we should focus some more effort on again. The overall guild is a great place to make new friends and learn new skills and improve our techniques but new members often struggle with feeling included in a large group where many members have known each other for years. Long-standing members are often so excited to see old friends at guild meetings and catch up that there isn't time to get acquainted with new members. And, often new members don't even know that small groups exist.

Friendship groups are an excellent way to connect with other guild members and make new sewing friends. Formed by members of the guild these small are small groups usually 4-12 members with each having their own meeting schedule and focus.

So. Joan Willcocks and I had tentatively started hosting small sessions on Friday mornings before the daytime guild meetings. We were doing a little skill-building but mostly offering opportunity to get to know people in the guild. We had a session on making guilted hearts for the I Found a Quilted Heart Project and a session on making the guild name badge. It's been really fun to get to know new members and hopefully make them feel welcome. Then meeting in-person came to a halt and now that everything is virtual, I've been hosting a few small group Friday zooms. That's been fun, too and a nice opportunity to introduce old and new members.

Now guild meetings like everything else in life have gone virtual. So, for now it looks like distanced small groups are our best option until things improve. The thing is, I can't host every small group myself and it works best with less than a dozen or so people online.

I'm asking if others in the guild will help by stepping up to host some more virtual small groups. I think our Friday group is going to focus on applique but find your tribe and hop online. Embroidery, free motion, fabric dyeing, tiny quilts—the sky's the limit.

I'm using Zoom and I have a paid subscription of \$14.99 a month which allows me more than the 40-minute limit you get on the free membership

but there are many other platforms available, both free and paid that might work for you. BTW: most non-free platforms for small groups would only require one paid subscription and that's for the host. I haven't asked those who join me to chip in on my subscription but if it's a hardship for you, I'm sure those who join you might help with a few dollars.

Some other virtual meeting platforms you might use are Google Hangouts, Go to Meeting, and if you have a group with Apple devices, FaceTime now supports groups up to 32 people.

And, if the virtual world isn't comfortable for you, block exchanges, round robins, sew-alongs are all still doable like we used to in the old days—by snail mail.

A Baby's Helping Hand provides a bag full of necessities through our Gifts & Giggles program with baby outfits, blankets, diapers and wipes, etc. to mothers in need as they leave the hospital with their newborn. A Baby's Helping Hand will deliver gift bags to families through its partnerships with local hospitals and other social services organizations.

QGSC Coordinator: Barb Moyle

QGSC plans to make baby quilts. They should be no smaller than 36x36 and no larger than 48X48, not necessary to be square. (example: 36X48)



### **Quilts of Valor**

Coordinator for fabric kits: Wanda Huderski

Presentation coordinator: Wilma Johnson

- Our plan is to identify WW2 and Korean War veterans
- If you are aware one of these veterans who has not been honored with a QOV please contact Wanda
- Each quilt will include a pillowcase
- Quilt sizes: Minimum: 55" x 65" through Maximum: 72" x 90" and the most common size is 60" x 80"
- Fabric and pattern choices: Fabric used should be high quality 100% "shirt-weight" or "quilt-weight" cotton fabric appropriate for adults. While Quilts of Valor do not have to be red, white, and blue, most recipients, given a choice, choose quilts that are patriotic in theme. Patterns and blocks can be of any design suitable for a patriotic theme.
- Use of military-branch-specific fabrics (Army,

Navy, etc.) or non-"patriotic" fabric (overly floral), unless the recipient is known in advance, may create difficulty in identifying a recipient.

• We will register the guilts on QOV website.

## Wellspring Living Team Community Service Update:

We have been working on putting together blocks from the Community
Service Sew-in. With additional blocks added, we'll have about 10 throw-size (48 x 60") tops ready for quilting in June. Our goal is 24 quilts to be divided between two Wellspring Living residential programs.

One of the 13-month residential programs is for girls ages 12-17 providing trauma-informed care to survivors of Domestic Minor Sex Trafficking in the service of physical, emotional and spiritual restoration. The other helps young women transition out of foster care or other placement, preparing young women to become socially, emotionally and personally independent of social services while connecting them to life-long permanency connections and laying the foundation for the pursuit of educational and career opportunities.

If you have finished quilts that you think would help us meet the goal that we've set for Wellspring Living, please launder them and save them until we can meet in person so that we can showntell before they're collected.

If you have tops and you think you can quilt them yourself, and you need batting or backing, please let me know and I will try to get some dropped off to you. If you have a top only to donate, let me know and I will make arrangements to get it from you. We also need volunteers who can quilt this size (48X60") on longarm or domestic machine and volunteers to sew on bindings.

Our regularly scheduled June program will be held online on Friday, June 5th at 1:30 pm on ZOOM.



What does this mean to you? What does this mean to your family? What does this mean for our country?


How can you best commemorate this milestone?
