My mind gets side-tracked with thoughts of reconfiguring my scrap system. But I don't want to just collect scraps, I want to use them, so I pull myself back to the projects...the one's I've already started, the ideas I've collected, the new skills I want to learn in this scrappy year.

One project I want to finish is the Wild Waves quilt from Nancy Mahoney's workshop. Paper piecing makes me marvel at the ease of getting precision. Another project is the disappearing nine patch I started last fall because of a great Zoom presentation the guild had in 2021. That's one of the things I love about the guild, the endless opportunity to learn and develop my skills.

Nancy talked about being totally scrappy and blindly drawing the next scrap from a bag. She doesn't do that because she likes more control. I like control too, but I find that if I don't challenge my brain, I am limited in my creativity. I love abstract, but it's difficult to create it, because my brain seeks uniformity.

It's going to be a scrappy year. I wonder what my list and my accomplishments will look like. As a group, I look forward to seeing your creativity develop as you design and sew with your scraps in 2022!



Quilts should be no larger than 36" x 36" and include a label with your and the quilt's name.



Meeting was called to order by Jane McAfee at 7:00 PM.
