### President's Message - Judy Daymont

Wow! Talk about being overstimulated! Between QuiltCon and Linda Hahn's trunk show and workshop, I have so many ideas for quilts that I'm having trouble deciding where to start.

While I missed joining the gang on Thursday, I declared that I was "over" covid and attended QuiltCon (with mask) for a few hours on Sunday. Below are some of my thoughts, as well as reactions from some of you.

- · Modern quilts have evolved, matured and come into their own. They are no longer identified by mediocre workmanship and a lot of negative space.
- The quilts and the vendors offered up distinctive color palettes and fabrics that we just don't see in our local quilt shops. Solids are not just for Amish quilts anymore!
- Borders and bindings were few and far between. This is a lesson for all of us. Let's question whether a border is adding more than just size to our quilt. Facings are an easy alternative to binding for wall quilts, and don't interrupt the design.
- · I was glad to see curves so well represented in the quilts! Many were reinterpretations of the arc, circle or drunkard's path block.
- It was wonderful to let each quilt just "wash over me"; but reading the author's comments frequently enhanced the experience.
- · Congratulations to member Myla Chapman, whose 2020 QGSC Challenge quilt "55" made it into QuiltCon and sold!

I want to thank our intrepid Programs committee (Susan Peryam, Deb Sweeney and Karen Shelnutt) for making Linda Hahn's visit possible. Twenty of us gathered to learn her unique approach to guaranteed-smooth New York Beauty blocks. In addition to being an organized and gifted instructor, Linda led us in some Zumbalike dancing to "New York, New York". Fun time was had by all!

I hope you will check out what's next in our Programs line-up [see p. 4]. And don't forget to make your reservation for our 25th Anniversary Luncheon on April 29th. [See p. 5 for more details]. The list of folks already signed up is attached.






