



Your design should showcase the fabric in your bundle. See below for information about the fabric bundles.

You may add your own fabric and you don't have to use every fabric in the bundle.

Challenge yourself by using a new technique or a familia one with a new look.

Quilts should be no larger than 36" x 36" and include a label with your and the guilt's name.

Quilts are due by June 23 and will be displayed at the July day & night meetings.

Winners will be announced at the July 28th (night) meeting.
