The original design, "To Quote Elvis Costello," features machine applique and lyrics from a Costello song. The quilt is dedicated to Jenny's brother, Michael Hynes (1963-2021), who introduced her to music by Costello and lots of other great artists.



An exhibit to get on your calendar: The Southeastern Quilt and Textile Museum is one of four venues in the United States to feature highlights from Quilt Nihon, an international quilt competition from Japan. SQTM is the exclusive Southeastern host for this celebrated exhibition, which premiers at the Tokyo Metropolitan Art Museum before traveling internationally. It features the most extraordinary and innovative works from the biennial competition of the Japanese Handicraft Instructors' Association (JHIA), which sponsors the largest international guilt contest in Japan and one of the most prestigious in the world. This year's Quilt Nihon Exhibition features 50 award-winning and notable works, including 13 entries from the competition's newest category, miniature quilts. It will be on display at SQTM sqtmuseum.org from April - June 22, 2024.

Thank you to everyone who participated in the Community Service Sew-Ins in January. Your contribution to our Quilt of Valor project is wonderfully appreciated.


