I (Jane McAfee) took a few notes during Tara Faughnan's "Telling Your Story Through Color and Design" on Friday, May 3. As I review them, I thought you might enjoy them too.

Use a photo as inspiration for color balance.

"Color gets all the credit. Value does all the work."

Disrupt pattern with color

Areas of high contrast move our eyes around and areas of low contrast allows our eyes to rest.

You need distance to see the interaction of value

Play with color 15 minutes a day. Play with colors you resist. No color combo is ugly. Pick colors and make blocks. "The fear of wasting fabric will hamper creativity."

Ask yourself "What does the quilt want?"

PS: Tara picked the six colors above for the Windham Ruby + Bee 2025 Fabric Challenge. You need to be a member of the Modern Quilt Guild to participate.


