President's Message - Judy Daymont

Happy New Year! The year has gotten off to a great start with last Friday's workshop and program. A big "Thank You!" goes out to Evie Tomlinson and her dream team: Katie, Charlotte and Juliet for guiding us in making our Face collages. I know I thoroughly enjoyed visiting the "Guild Fair" booths to gather info on our 2023 programs and to sign up for classes. If you skipped the refreshment table, you missed some yummy desserts.

At the end of each year, I update my "UFO List" and take stock of my little guilting world. I was satisfied with the number of completed projects (15) in 2022. However, I lost ground with five more quilts waiting to be quilted and eight more quilts under construction. [Notice that I'm not divulging the total number in those categories!!] did achieve one goal - which was to divest myself of most of my scraps. Of those completed projects, 5 were scrap quilts and I reduced my scrap storage footprint drastically, as well.

I haven't abandoned my love of scraps. They will feature prominently in my focus for 2023, which I'm calling: "Put It In Neutral!" [or "PIIN"]. I want to experiment with quilts using mostly neutral fabrics. This will include warm tones like beige, khaki, tobacco & brown; and cool ones like white, gray, taupe and black. I already have ideas for 4 PIIN quilts and hope to have more.

I was bowled over that so many of you [I estimate at least 90%] formulated some type of quilting plan or goals for 2023. Moreover, the vast majority fully expect to make progress on those plans. Way to go! Feel free to share your progress toward your goals during Show & Tell or post on the Guild's facebook page. I'm sure you will be an inspiration to all of us.

In Person - Zoom Meetings - As you know, the pandemic brought about a lot of changes. We have found that some professional guilters are no longer traveling. In order to provide a wide array of speakers, from both near and far, we will continue to book a few programs on Zoom. We have heard you and know that most of you want to meet in person to enjoy all that a guild meeting has to offer. Therefore, we are going to try out an "In Person - Zoom" experience at our night meeting on January 26. The presenter, Emily Taylor, will broadcast over Zoom, members attending in person and those at home can watch. The rest of the meeting will take place as usual at FPC and may not come through well over Zoom. Please be patient with us as we experiment with this new approach.

I hope 2023 will be the best year yet!


