

First Lesson: Acts 2:1-21

First Lesson is from the second chapter of Acts

1 When the day of Pentecost had come, [the apostles] were all together in one place. 2 And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. 3 Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. 4 All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

5 Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. 6 And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. 7 Amazed and astonished, they asked, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? 8 And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? 9 Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, 10 Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, 11 Cretans and Arabs—in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power." 12 All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, "What does this mean?" 13 But others sneered and said, "They are filled with new wine."

14 But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them, "Men of Judea and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say. 15 Indeed, these are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o'clock in the morning. 16 No, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel:

17 'In the last days it will be, God declares,

that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh,

and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy,

and your young men shall see visions,

and your old men shall dream dreams.

18 Even upon my slaves, both men and women,

in those days I will pour out my Spirit;

and they shall prophesy.

19 And I will show portents in the heaven above

and signs on the earth below,

blood, and fire, and smoky mist.

20 The sun shall be turned to darkness

and the moon to blood.



I would like to make you all aware of some changes to the upcoming special congregational meetings.

Unfortunately, the first voting meeting scheduled for June 8th, regarding whether our congregation will stay affiliated with the ELCA, must be postponed until July 6th. Upon speaking with Bishop Rinehart, our congregation is required to meet with him two weeks prior to holding our first vote.

Bishop Rinehart is now scheduled to meet with our congregation (in person) on June 22nd. Additionally, council would like the research committee to present their information on June 22nd as well following our church service. It is important that the research committee has the opportunity to share their findings with our congregation (without interruptions) and provide specific information about the (5) denominations that they researched. We want to ensure that our congregation is well-informed ahead of the first vote on July 6th.

The tentative schedule for June 22nd will be as follows:

- Worship service (no communion)
- Research committee presentation and Q&A with the congregation
- Congregational lunch
- Meeting with Bishop Rinehart (12:30 pm)

I would also like to address the question that was asked regarding the North American Lutheran Church (NALC) as the only choice for an alternative affiliation when we hold the first vote. Based on the research committee's findings and council's own research and discernment, it was determined (by council) that the ELCA no longer aligns with our congregation's theological convictions and mission.

Council's intent was to simplify the voting process by narrowing down the selection to the synod (NALC) that most closely aligns with our congregation's bible-based, Christ-centered ministry. However, the research committee will cover specific information regarding each of the Lutheran synods they researched so that you can decide for yourselves which denomination makes the most sense for our congregation.
