From the Desk of Pastor Stephanie Stark:



Cheryl Mellenthin of Cat Spring received an Honorary Doctor of Veterinary Medicine degree from Kansas State University on May 13. Cheryl founded PUPS - Prevent Unwanted Pets 19 years ago. Since that time PUPS has helped spay and neuter over 38,000 dogs and cats for people who cannot afford to pay for it on their own in nine counties west of Houston. Cheryl also donated a mobile spay/neuter unit to Kansas State University. The students in the College of Veterinary Medicine travel to animal shelters throughout Kansas and southern Nebraska, and have spayed and neutered over 32,000 dogs and cats.

St. John Lutheran Church-Cat Spring Council Meeting Minutes July 11, 2022

The meeting was called to order at 6:22 p.m. by Jennifer Logan.

Pastor Stephanie Stark presented the opening devotional from 1 Kings 19: 10-13. We often see God in the big, bold, and/or destruction but Elijah found God in the silence. She asked everyone to ponder and reflect in silence for one minute on what our hopes and dreams were for the church. Responses included hopes that Pastor would stay for a long time, happiness that members have started coming back to church, and exponential growth of the congregation and youth. Also, that members would heal and have a positive attitude in the congregation including more participation in church activities and volunteers to help with youth teaching and activities. Finally, that the church body would grow incorporating current congregation members and new families from the surrounding communities.

Members present were Pastor Stephanie Stark, Jennifer Logan, Melissa Schmidt, <u>Kyle Eckhardt, Ryan Reibenstein</u>, and Sharon Meiers.

Ruth Walker was absent.

Guests included Jheri Sell and Jamie Hoffman with Church Mutual Insurance Company. Christa Klar was unable to attend because she is at camp this week with one of the youth.

Motion made by Sharon, seconded by Ryan to approve the agenda with the addition of advertising discussion under new business. Motion passed.

The June 2022 meeting minutes were read and approved by email. Motion made by Ryan, seconded by Melissa to approve the minutes as read. Motion approved.


Jamie Hoffman with Church Mutual Insurance presented and reviewed the Property Coverage, General Liability Coverage, Crime Coverage, Professional Liability Coverage, Professional Liability Coverage Part Claims Made, and Hired and Non owned Automobile Liability Coverage Declaration Pages. The insurance was paid in June 2022. There were questions about the amount of coverage on the Parsonage since it has been updated and about liability with transporting youth to outside activities. Jamie will run a current cost estimate analysis due to all the improvements in the Parsonage. She also explained that paid church members and Council members who transport children are covered by not only their personal insurance but also by the Church Mutual Insurance coverage. In addition, she recommended getting a waiver signed before volunteers transport youth or other members on activities occurring away from the church.

Ruth was unable to attend the meeting, so Jheri Sell presented the Treasurer's report including a statement of activity for June 2022. The total revenue for June was \$ 19,038. Expenses were \$ 21,668 so we were \$ 2,630 short for the month. Motion made by Melissa and seconded by Pastor Stephanie to accept the report as presented. Motion passed.

Pastor Stephanie Stark reported that she joined the Camp Hope Writing Team and is excited to be writing the Worship curriculum for 2023. This camp was started over 30 years ago and can be found in churches across the globe. More information can be found in her Pastor's Report. She participated in a luncheon at Delores Dittert's house with the ladies that plan the Senior Serve lunches.

working on Rally Day and the Rocky Railroad themed Sunday School/VBS program that starts September 11th.

There was not a Cemetery committee report from Ken Wienken this month.

The House and Grounds report was presented by Ryan and Kyle. Kloss Electric came out and installed 17 LED lights in the Fellowship Hall. He looked at the kitchen, classrooms, and hallway to work on a bid for replacing those lights as well. There was a sponsor that donated the materials for the seventeen lights that were just installed so the final cost will be less than the original bid. The dishwasher in the parsonage is up and running now. The stovetop needs to be on a 40amp breaker but is operating on a 30-amp breaker currently. They will look into fixing this in the near future.

Old Business:

The 2022 Church Directory is almost done. Christa and Sally are working to complete it. Pastor reported that it is close to completion.

The fireproof safe was installed this past week in the storage building. Its final placement is pending. It may be moved into the Fellowship Hall in Classroom 4 if there is room.

We are still waiting on ladders tall enough to clean the ceiling fans and area above the altar. Jennifer will forward an article that was sent to her about cleaning using extension poles and cloths that may be helpful.

Jennifer got clarification that the scholarships provided by the church do not need to be reported on 1099 because they are gifts from a non-profit organization. Full scholarships and those from other organizations fall under different rules and need to be reported. Motion was made by Jennifer, seconded by Pastor Stephanie to continue as we have always done without a 1099 for scholarships given. Motion passed.

Jennifer has four addresses to give to the prayer shawl committee. Motion made by Ryan, seconded by Sharon to provide the additional addresses to the committee once the church directory is completed.

Jennifer looked at risers to raise the altar cross. She found white linen cloths that can be placed over the books being used now. Jennifer will donate them to the church. Motion made by Ryan, seconded by Melissa to use the white linens to cover the books and raise the cross when the flowers placed on the altar are too tall.

New Business:

Jennifer checked into advertising costs for our church. Jeff Brandes with Visual Promotions has offered to give us a 40% discount on 8ft by 4 ft banners. There are two options for advertising in the Sealy News. The Faith page ads are \$18-\$36 per week or the Business Directory page ads are \$30-\$40 per week. Possible areas to hang the banners were discussed. Other opportunities for advertising include the Fantasy of Lights and the Austin County Fair. Advertising will be tabled until the next meeting.
