



#### Council Meeting Minutes February 13, 2023

Page 1

The meeting was called to order by Jennifer Logan at 6:22 P.M.

Opening Devotional: Led by Pastor Stephanie Stark. John 3:16. Discussed the book "Belonging" and that God loves everyone.

Members Present: Jennifer Logan, Robin Haugen, Cheryl Mellenthin, Chad Divin and Pastor Stephanie.

Members Absent: Ryan Reibenstein and Kyle Eckhardt.

Guest: Christa Klar

Motion made to accept the agenda by Pastor Stephanie and seconded by Jennifer Logan. Passed unanimously.

Minutes of January meeting approved unanimously via email or text.

Treasurer report: Report sent by Jheri Castic- Sell. There is one reimbursable expense: A payment was inadvertently made to the IRS that will be reimbursed. Taking that into account, income was \$704.36 under budget for January. There was a water leak outside that caused the water bill to be \$196.60 instead of the usual \$83. Motion made to accept the treasurer report by Robin and seconded by Cheryl. Motion approved unanimously.

Pastor Report: Pastor Stephanie had several visits and meetings In January. She attended the Conference Gathering in LaGrange and a System's Theory Class. She will be at St. John on Ash Wednesday, Feb. 22. March 1, 8, 15, 22, and 29 she will be doing Lent services at various churches as part of a Conference Gathering Lenten Service Rotation. Pastors from those various churches will be doing Lent Services at St. John, with a different pastor each week. Addendum to the minutes: the Bishop will be visiting St. John on March 5. There will be luncheon after the service. Motion to approve Pastor's report by Jennifer, seconded by Chad, passed unanimously.

#### **Committee Reports:**

Youth: Christa Is working on summer camp for first time campers, a possible summer work program, fundraisers (Wall crosses made from the old manger that used to be in the Christmas program, Camp Café or chili cookoff), Ten Commandments movie night, Smash Burger night, Cosmic Air, and Roller or Ice Skating. The "Boat" series is finished and a study of Moses will begin.

Cemetery Report: given to Robin from Ken Wienken. Tree trimming and brush removal in progress.

House and Grounds: Report given to Jennifer from Kyle: Ceiling tiles in choir area have been changed out, but leak still appears to be there, despite it being worked on. Will have that looked at again. Kloss Electric is being contacted about outdoor security lights. The heater by the kitchen and classrooms needed a part.

#### **Old Business:**

Audit Committee report by Chad: members were Bill Barr, Laurie Eckhardt and Brenda Menke. They met on Feb. 5 to complete the audit. Quilters closed their bank account, and it is now included in the St. John books.

Bank accounts have been updated with new council member signatures. Industry Bank CD renews in June.

As Jennifer will be out of town, Robin will handle the Annual Congregational Report meeting on Feb. 19. There is no quorum required for this meeting.

#### **New Business:**

Reviewed Rental Policy and Rates for the sanctuary and fellowship hall. New rates are as follows: Fellowship Hall: Groups of 40 or less: \$50 for members and \$200 for nonmembers. For 41+ people it will cost members \$100 and nonmembers \$250. There will be a \$20 per hour additional charge per hour for more than four hours. Nonmembers will have a \$200 refundable deposit if facilities are not left in disrepair. Additional charges will be assessed if there are damages to the property.

Sanctuary: no charge for members, \$200 for nonmembers. There is no charge for the Fellowship Hall or Church for funerals if the pastor of St. John conducts the funeral. The pastor can receive an honorarium. If using our organist, the cost will be \$100. There will be a \$100 cleaning fee for the church and fellowship hall. Bulletins will cost \$50 if the church needs to provide them. Cheryl moved to accept the changes, Robin seconded, unanimously approved.

Cheryl passed out updated information sheets with phone numbers/email addresses and committee information. Motion to grant permission to tape the meetings for accurate minutes made by Jennifer, seconded by Chad, passed unanimously.

Reviewed and signed agreement with Austin County to use the fellowship hall for voting on May 6 and Nov. 7 in 2023, and March 5, May 4 & 28, and Nov 5 in 2024.

Jheri Sell will be in charge of money counters in the future. Council recommended that the current form used to count money be updated to make it more user friendly.

Council discussed current altar flower situation (lack of people signing up to bring flowers). There are no guidelines for flowers in the church bylaws or Altar Guild information sheets. Either one or two arrangements can be on the altar - both are acceptable.
