One day, a friend and her daughter came in, and we listened to their story in regards to her daddy. They needed assistance with his funeral. We shared Jesus' love for them. Along with the funeral home, the FCM, and another ministry, made arrangements for the funeral. Shortly after, the daughter received Jesus as Savior and was baptized.



One of our South Carolina Church partners returned in June. It is always a joy to have friends from our home state. Our friends from New Hope BC in Seneca came to serve, and we showed them the ministry's needs. The mission house had some rain and wind damage. The Agape house had outdoor damage from the black bears getting into the garage cans. The team used their skills and talents to serve in God's ministry. The men repaired a roof, installed vinyl siding on the mission house, and put a wood skirt around the Agape House deck. While the women served in the FC shop and warehouse. The donations were inspected, sorted, and the shop was stocked for the families to meet their needs.



A Kentucky church came on its first journey to Lynch to help the community. They worked with several families and replaced a wooden fence at Agape House.



Here is another way God used us at FC. A couple from Virginia came over to Lynch for a friend's funeral and needed a necktie. A restaurant worker told him about FCM. He got a black tie. They were running late, so they asked to change clothes in the bathroom.

Other folks are just driving by and come in for prayer needs.



The July Back-to-School Mission Week was for God's glory. In obedience, four churches came on the annual journey: Buck Creek BC, Longs, SC, Wampee BC, Longs, SC, Indian Lake BC, Northport, AL, Memorial BC, Frankfort, KY, and 3 other churches were represented.

Father God is faithful. He blessed FCM with 70 volunteers who loved on 235 children and their parents. On Friday, two volunteer teams went up to Beaver Creek School and served 31 children. We are thankful for the Holy Spirit saving 26 souls. The local church will be contacted for follow-up with these salvation decisions. The volunteers served the community and the school children with love. Each child received food, new clothes, and new shoes at the foot-washing tent. They enjoyed playing outdoor games and getting their faces painted after a haircut. The last tent to visit was for family prayer.

The ministry's needs are to be basic: shoes, bed sheets, bed blankets, comforters, towels, and housewares that include pots, pans, and silverware only. Thank you for your partnership in God's work and ministry.
