

Augusta Shores Owners Association Wildlife Policy

In order to preserve the natural beauty of Augusta Shores we have adopted the following policy regarding feeding of wildlife.

Section 10.09 of the Declaration of Protective Covenants, Conditions and Restriction of Augusta Shores (the "Declaration") says:

Section 10.09. Trees and Other Natural Features. No trees or shrubs more than 3" in trunk diameter other than trees or shrubs under or within 25 feet of any physical improvement existing or to be undertaken, including but not necessarily limited to a house and driveway) shall be removed from any Lot or portion of the Property except with the written permission of the Board of Directors of the Association, which, in its discretion, may adopt and promulgate rules and regulations regarding the preservations of trees and other natural resources and wildlife upon the Property.

Feeding of Wildlife

On the recommendation of the Missouri Department of Conservation, the Board of Directors of the Augusta Shores Owners Association voted on May 9, 2020 to adopt this Rule:

Except for the feeding of birds, feeding other wildlife (including, but not limited to deer) is **not** permitted. "Feeding" includes, but is not limited to, feeding corn, other grains or oilseeds, salt blocks or any other material.
