Obituary

Charlotte Denise (Warren) Lockhart was born in Louisville, Kentucky on August 14, 1952, to the late Lawrence Orlando Warren and Sallie Mae Warren. She accepted Christ at an early age and became a member of West Chesnut Baptist Church of Louisville, Kentucky. She served as a youth pianist at West Chestnut Baptist Church and also played for the male choir. Charlotte graduated from Male High School and continued her education at the University of Kentucky, receiving a Bachelor of Arts degree in Education. During her undergraduate studies at U.K., in 1971, she net and married the love of her life, a graduate engineering student, Pennon Lockhart from Alabama A&M University. To this union a daughter (Joi), and a son (Javonn), were born. They later relocated from Lexington, Kentucky to Atlanta, Georgia in 1977.

Charlotte continued her education by enrolling in Computer Data Processing at the Atlanta Technical College and in recognition of her exceptional cademic achievements and leadership qualities; Charlotte was selected as the 1983 recipient of the Georgia Occupational Award of Leadership (GOAL) by the Governor of the State of Georgia, 1983. (This award came with a new car that was later used to teach our children to drive.) She became an elementary school teacher at the newly formed Greenforest Christian Academy, Decatur, Georgia and received an associate degree in Theological Studies from the Greenforest Bible Institute. She later became employed with the Fulton County School System and continued her educational pursuits with a Master of Education degree; (1995), and an Educational Specialist degree (1996) from Brenau University. She earned the Doctor of Education degree, in Curriculum and Instruction, from the University of Sarasota in 2002. Dr. Lockhart received numerous awards and recognitions for her contributions to education over the years. Charlotte was an advocate for children and was dedicated to improving their quality of life through educational development. She retired from the Fulton County School system (while at Renaissance Elementary, Fairburn, GA.) after 25 years of dedicated service to the Fulton County School system.

Dr. Charlotte Lockhart served with her husband in ministry and missions as they traveled Internationally to many countries in Africa, and other global locations. She was the editor for his books published through Global Vision Ministries along with other Bible Study publications. When her husband, Rev. Dr. Pennon Lockhart, was called to serve as the Senior Pastor of the Greenforest Community Baptist Church, her support role was very essential during the Covid-19 Pandemic. In earlier years, Charlotte became the music director at the Transformation Christian Fellowship Church, where her husband was appointed pastor by the Synod of the City (North Georgia Presbytery). Her piano lessons during her childhood served the Lord well in those early days of ministry.

As a three time cancer survivor, Charlotte's faith strengthened with each hard fought battle. Through it all she never complained. As an avid reader, she continued to attend her book club meetings, book editing and served as the secretary for the Chippewa Forest Homeowners Association. She truly loved her family and the best times were sitting at the kitchen table laughing, listening to music and passing valuable nuggets of wisdom. She fully supported her family in all their endeavors, especially her children and grandchildren who continue to excel academically and enjoyed spending time with their Nana.

Charlotte is preceded in death by her parents: Lawrence O. Warren and Sallie Mae Warren; and brother, Larry Warren.

Charlotte is survived by her loving husband of 54 years, Pennon Lockhart; daughter; Joi (Dwayne) Pettus; son, Javonn Lockhart; sister, Karleen (Keith) Wyatt; two grandchildren: Jalen and Lauren; and niece, Kristin. We will miss her greatly.
