

I haven't played on hard courts since **Miami**, so I'm very happy to be back on this surface."

12:08 **Medvedev** "I think the thing always about my seasons is that a lot of times when I come to this stage, which is **Canada**, whatever happened before doesn't matter too much because that's really usually the best part of the season for me. What I'm not happy [with] in a way is I don't have a title, but I'm playing [well at] the biggest tournaments and I lost to some great guys."

As much as **Auger-Aliassime** was executing very well and imposing his game-style, **Medvedev** just didn't look as comfortable tracking things down on the back foot on the clay. He was just a bit too error prone on the backhand side though, and didn't get much offensive boost to make up for it, with **Davidovich Fokina**'s ability to get in and out of the corners working wonders to neutralise his aggression and power. 20:03 **Davidovich Fokina** had to draw on his new-found mental strength during his journey from **California** to **Florida**, when he was stuck in a plane at the airport for over eight hours. It was a test of the Spaniard's new-found mental fortitude, leaving his hotel in **Indian Wells** at 8:15 a.m. last Wednesday only to eventually arrive at his accommodation in **Miami** at 11:00 a.m. the following day... without any luggage! "The day after losing to **Medvedev** [in **Indian Wells**], we had a flight at 11:00 a.m. to **Dallas** and then another from **Dallas** to **Miami**," remembers 'Foki' as he begins to recount his ordeal. "And halfway along they tell us that we have to divert to **Austin** because there was a tornado in **Dallas**. And we had to wait for it to go in order to continue the journey. In the end we were sitting on the plane not doing anything for eight hours." The challenge presented by his trip to **Miami** is an example, and it is one that **Davidovich Fokina** overcame with aplomb. The Russian was the far superior player in the first set, utilising the serving advantage really well and **Davidovich Fokina was having a tough time really keeping his patience in check, hitting out for too early** in points. But in the second set the balance of control and power had considerably shifted with **Davidovich Fokina** now tactically doing more to unsettle **Medvedev**, with more forecourt rushes and mixed spread of success with the drop shot, but his shot selection under pressure was what would set him back largely in a set he otherwise should have claimed. **Davidovich Fokina** went 0/6 on break points while **Medvedev managed his game the better in the wind simply by choosing to get balls in court and let Davidovich Fokina make the ambitious plays. MTO: Medvedev** saw the trainer twice, midgame at 3/3 and again at 3/4 in the second set to patch up a thumb injury. **Medvedev** 24w 12ue; **Davidovich Fokina** 24w 24ue. **Medvedev** 6/3 7/5

The **Returning Players** tab highlights any player that retired last time out or is returning from an injury lay-off, while the **Playing Styles or Match-ups** tab will include any post that references the **Playing Style** of a player of a specific **Match-Up** observation, which is a good feature for helping to build player profiles.

The interface is designed to provide real-time updates on tennis matches and player conditions.

As a bookmaker/tennis trader, I will leave the ticker on auto refresh to poll away on one of my monitors, alerting me to player **withdrawals** and **injury news**.

I can also continue to use the first pain to manually check for news. Often, if there is a rush of money against a player, there is usually an injury angle (e.g. the player took a MTO in their last match, they are returning from an injury lay-off, or they have said/posted something negative about a current injury).

I also start my trading day getting up to speed using the Chrome extension "**Read Aloud: A Text to Speech Voice Reader**" which reads the Ticker content to me.
