Carnegie Library Building celebrates 120 years!

In September of 1903, the cornerstone was laid at Frances and High to start the construction of the first public library in Kaufman County. Six short months later on March 15, 1904, the Carnegie Public Library opened its doors to the people of Terrell and the community of Kaufman County as a whole.

Boasting over 3000 books, donated by the citizens of Terrell, a grand stair case that led to study rooms, and a public auditorium, the Terrell Carnegie Library was an amazing addition to a growing and prosperous town.


Many local civic groups were responsible for securing the grant of \$10,000 from Andrew Carnegie.

The library served the city of Terrell through the 1980s until it was transitioned to the Terrell Heritage Museum.



- Andrew Carnegie built 2,509 libraries worldwide between 1883 and 1929.
- Of those, 1,795 were in the United States: 1,687 public libraries and 108 academic.
- 32 Carnegie Libraries built in Texas.
- Only 13 Carnegie Libraries still stand in Texas with Terrell being one of them.

Texas Arbor Day Celebration & Dedication




