Pastor's Page

I recently finished a book, entitled *The Greatness of the Kingdom* by Alva McClain. Toward the end of this rather lengthy book McClain asked the question, "Is the world getting better or worse?". He doesn't ask the question as of himself, but is making an observation that it is a question frequently asked. McClain published his work in 1959. As we look back, we would consider 1959 as a much more simple time as compared to life today. This is the era that gave us such TV shows as: Father Knows Best, Leave It To Beaver, My Three Sons, and Ozzie and Harriet. This was the era of black-and-white TV if you were fortunate enough to own one. There was never a mention of world conflict, and every problem that existed in these homes was resolved by the end of the show.

Even though 1959 may seem to have been a more civil and peaceful era it was not without its problems. This was the period between Korea and Vietnam. Those of us who lived during the Vietnam era, will remember such things as the court-marshal of William Calley, and the Kent State shootings. For those of us who lived through this era, it seemed very chaotic. We may have very well been asking ourselves the same question, "Is the world getting better or worse?" Even though HG Wells referred to World War I as 'The War to and all Wars' it does not seem to have played out in his favor.

We may be familiar with the words of Jesus when he declared, "you will hear of wars and rumors of wars". But this statement which comes from Matthew 24:6 is incomplete. For Jesus goes on to say, "but see to it that you are not alarmed." How is it that you can 'not be alarmed' while at the same time hearing about 'wars and rumors of wars'? There is a theological position known as postmillennialism. This position is primarily based on the idea that the world will get better and better with time. They believe the world will continue to improve until the world turns into God's kingdom. This position was very popular in the 1800s but was given up by most with the advent of WW I and WW II.

There must be some overriding principal in the Christian's life that enables him to live a, "not alarmed" kind of life. Paul declares his position in Galatians 2:20 "I have been crucified with Christ; and it is no longer I who live, but Christ lives in me; and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself up for me." Just as the laws of aerodynamics enables a large commercial aircraft to overcome the power of gravity, we also need something beneath our wings to carry us through turbulent times.

The prophet Isaiah states this principal quite clearly in chapter 40. "Yet those who wait for the LORD Will gain new strength; They will mount up with wings like eagles, They will run and not get tired, They will walk and not become weary." I am often reminded of an old hymn that I learned as a child, "The Lord knows the way through the wilderness. All I have to do is follow." Sometimes life is complicated simply because we make it so.



Samaritan's Purse

After sharing the story of the Good Samaritan, Jesus said "Go and do likewise." That is the mission of Samaritan's Purse—to follow the example of Christ by helping those in need and proclaiming the hope of the Gospel.

A young girl and her family are encouraged through the outreach of Operation Christmas Child after a fire destroyed their neighborhood.

Notebooks and pencils were some of the items that immediately caught Fernanda's attention when she peered inside of her shoebox gift. She'd be going back to school in a few months and had no supplies to take with her—everything she owned had burned during a fire a few weeks earlier. The inferno had attacked the community in southern Chile, turning nearly every home into ashes and rubble. In just a few hours, the house where 12-year-old Fernanda lived with her parents and younger brother was gone.

Fernanda's grief was still raw when she attended the Operation Christmas Child outreach event at a local church. She was in shock, trying to make sense of how quickly and significantly her life had changed.

The event offered the hurting young girl moments of joy during a season of sadness. Her shoebox gift was the first present she had received since losing all of her belongings in the fire.

"That day was a surprise, because people I didn't know were giving me a present," Fernanda said. "They were giving me love."

Fernanda has always been a kind and giving child. She enjoys creating paper flowers for friends and family. She helps take care of her brother and makes her parents cards on Mother's Day and Father's Day.

After the fire, it was Fernanda who needed support because, like her entire community, her heart was broken. God used the Operation Christmas Child event—including the vibrant worship songs that Fernanda enjoyed so much—to bring comfort and encouragement when she needed it the most.
