



Pastor's Page

I'm sure we're all aware of what's going on in Minnesota. We might not fully understand what it is that the protesters want or what it is that ICE is trying to accomplish, but at the very minimum we understand that these two groups are not getting along. But it is not sufficient simply to take one position over against the other. It is incumbent upon you, that is you are obligated, to defend the position you take. But to do that we have to think very deeply about the issues that we're facing. Many have described our time as the age of non-reason. By this they mean that we don't think deeply about anything anymore. As a result, we have a more visceral or emotional response to the issues. As a result, people of influence no longer communicate via rational thought or argument but rather they communicate with slogans, symbols and highly edited pictures. These are not intended to engage the mind, they are employed to ignite the emotions and by this move their audience to action. They begin with the conclusion and disregard the argument. They say, "this is how you should feel about this", not "this is how you should think about this".

We are witnessing the results of this in the public forum. People stop listening to one another when they begin to realize they have no rational recourse. As a result, they resort to name calling and labeling their opponent as some social outlier, such as racist or Xenophobic, or some other name that renders their opinion unworthy of being considered. We have become incredibly vulgar in our public exchange. Even at the highest levels of government, we have lost any sense of civil decorum.

So, what becomes of a society that does not respect the ideas of others. Well, it becomes exactly what we're seeing. We are becoming increasingly divided with no apparent solution in sight. But there is a solution that will be forced upon all of us, and nobody will be happy. It will be a solution of desperation. Eric Hoffer, who received the Presidential Medal of Freedom in 1983, once said, "When freedom destroys order, the yearning for order will destroy freedom." Peace at any price is not peace. This is only abdicating authority to those who are intent and capable of the greatest evil. Francis Schaeffer in speaking about this said, "At this Point the words left or right will make no difference. They are only two roads to the same end. There is no difference between an authoritarian government from the right or the left; the results are the same."

Jeremiah 6:14 says, "They have healed the brokenness of My people superficially saying, 'Peace, peace, But there is no peace'." When a nation that has been established on Christian principles loses that foundation it eventually gives up one of its basic tenets, and that is that man is created in the image of God. When we lose that single perspective, we also lose the value of humanity. Once that's gone, we can treat each other with the utmost contempt and devalue their opinions and their existence as something that's simply inconsequential. Life becomes cheap and expendable. In the words of Paul to the Ephesians, we have become, "Strangers to the covenants of promise, having no hope and without God in the world. But now in Christ Jesus you who formerly were far off have been brought near by the blood of Christ. For He Himself is our peace".


