Pastor's Page

I have taken up the subject of remembering on two recent occasions. The first was during last Sunday's message which considered a passage in Mark 8. Here Jesus was asking His disciples why it was that they did not remember the miracle which Jesus had just performed in feeding the 4000. He did this by blessing seven loaves of bread. But following this the disciples were worried that with only one loaf of bread they would not be able to feed a small group of perhaps only 12 or 13 people. The second occasion was at the community Memorial Day service. The whole purpose of a 'Memorial Service' is to remember. Here we remember those that served our country through military service, some of which gave the ultimate sacrifice. But it's not only the individuals we remember, but also the history of our country. One of my favorite lines in the speech given by our 16th president known as the Gettysburg Address says, "The world will little note, nor long remember what we say here...". Yet 161 years later we are still reading that speech to prompt our remembering.

Remembering gives meaning and value to life. It is a terrible loss when a family member who through some form of dementia loses their ability to remember, not only their past, but even the ability to recognize their loved ones. It might be said that memories not only give value to life, but rather memories are the essence of life itself.

The Scriptures speak of 'remembering' some 227 times. Some of those are given in the negative sense. An example is Psalm 25:7 where David prays, "Do not remember the sins of my youth." Yet the majority of times it is calling on us to remember the faithfulness of God. We are encouraged to review the Lord's provision in the past to calm our anxious thoughts. Psalm 42:6 says, "O my God, my soul is in despair within me, Therefore I remember You". Also, Psalm 77:11, "I shall remember the deeds of the Lord; Surely I will remember Your wonders of old."

We are not only encouraged to remember God's faithfulness but also to remember His instruction to us. Both Jude and Peter teach us to, "remember the words that were spoken beforehand," The Psalmist says, "I have hidden Your word in my heart that I might not sin against Thee."

We are also instructed to remember the needs of others. For example, Hebrews tells us to, "Remember the prisoners, as though in prison with them." And in the same 13th chapter to, "Remember those who led you, who spoke the word of God to you".

Remembering is of great value. I mentioned at the Memorials Day Service that a nation without history has no future. The same might apply to our lives spiritually. The longer we walk with the Lord the more opportunities we have to remember His faithfulness to us, it can become the greatest source of hope for our future.


I would like to thank all that were involved in the making of the prayer blanket I received after my shoulder surgery.


