The Waterhouse residence on 4th Avenue was recently sold, and in December it was torn down.

Since 1945, it was the home of Ray and Elmarie Water-house, who raised three children there and were active members of the Post Falls community.

Elmarie lived there until age 103.

Prior to Ray and Elmarie purchasing


the home, it was owned by Simeon and Almeda Berry, Ohio natives who moved to this area to farm. They also ran a boarding house in the home, which was located between Samuel and Ann Young's home and Oscar Reynolds' garage.

Today, the Young home is the Republic Kitchen + Taphouse.

The garage offered car repairs and blacksmithing services. The building was part of French Cleaners, which also was torn down in December to make room for a multi-story mixed use building, including apartments.
