IDAHO HERITATGE TRUST FUNDS POST FALLS HISTORICAL **SOCIETY-MUSEUM GUTTER PROJECT**

What about your red, white and blue license plates? Did you know that the Idaho Heritage Trust is a child of the Idaho Centennial (1890-1990)? Fifty cents from each license plate goes into the Idaho Heritage Trust, which funds preservation of historic structures throughout Idaho.

In Post Falls, the Idaho Heritage Trust has worked with Society members to preserve Post Falls historic structures including:

- Mullan Statue restoration
- The Old Church (the Jacklin Arts and Culture Center)
- Corbin Ditch Headgate (the Spokane Valley Irrigation Canal)
- North Gutter of the Chapin Building (owned by the City of Post Falls), preserved by the Society as our town's Museum

Special Thanks to Catherine McClintick, Cindy Mead, Carol Yost, and our membership for support of the gutter restoration project.

River City Electric and Bulldog Seamless Gutters installed a new gutter system and electric bead to prevent ice jams under the supervision of John Beacham, City Public Works Director.
