XX Environmental Policy – Taunton Motoring Club

1. Purpose

Taunton Motoring Club is committed to promoting sustainable practices within motorsport. We recognise the environmental impact of motorsport activities and strive to minimise our carbon footprint while ensuring a level of responsibility, education, and continuous improvement among our members, participants, and partners.

2. Scope

This policy applies to all club members, event participants, officials, volunteers, spectators, and third-party service providers involved in any activity organised or endorsed by Taunton Motoring Club.

3. Our Commitments

We are committed to:

a. Regulatory Compliance

- Complying with all relevant environmental laws, regulations, and motorsport governing body requirements.
- Meeting or exceeding standards set by national motorsport authorities (e.g., Motorsport UK, etc.).

b. Pollution Prevention

- Reducing emissions from vehicles where possible, including encouraging the use of cleaner fuels, efficient engines, and proper vehicle maintenance.
- Preventing oil, fuel, and chemical spills through the use of containment systems, drip trays, and responsible handling.
- Promoting noise reduction strategies and respecting local noise ordinances.

c. Waste Management

- Providing clearly marked waste and recycling bins at all events.
- Ensuring proper disposal of hazardous waste (e.g., oil, tires, batteries).

- Restoring event areas to pre-used conditions post-event, including any necessary cleanup or remediation.

e. Resource Efficiency

- Minimising water and energy use at events and club facilities.
- Encouraging digital communication to reduce paper use.
- Supporting the use of shared transport, carpooling, where practical.

f. Education and Awareness

- Promoting environmental awareness among members and attendees.
- Providing training or briefings on best environmental practices at club events.
- Encouraging innovation and member participation in sustainability initiatives.

g. Continuous Improvement

- Reviewing and updating the environmental policy annually.
- Setting measurable environmental goals and monitoring performance.
- Gathering feedback from members to improve environmental practices.

4. Roles and Responsibilities

- **Club Committee**: Ensures this policy is implemented and reviewed regularly.
- **Environmental Officer**: Oversees compliance, provides advice, and coordinates sustainability efforts.
- All Members and Participants: Expected to follow this policy and report any
 environmental concerns.

5. Communication

This policy will be:

- Displayed at all events and on our official website.
- Included in event programs, entry forms, and member materials.
- Promoted during driver briefings and volunteer training sessions.

6. Policy Review

This policy will be reviewed annually or following any significant changes in environmental legislation, club operations, or motorsport regulations.
