

REFLECTIONS FROM Fr. MATTHEW

"Called and Sent"


In today's Gospel, Jesus shares his mission to proclaim the kingdom of heaven with his disciples. The signs of the kingdom's presence consist of the work that Jesus has already been doing: the sick are cured, lepers are cleansed, demons are driven out, and the dead are raised to life. The disciples are sent to continue doing the work that Jesus has begun. This is a moment of transition in Matthew's Gospel. The focus has shifted from the ministry of Jesus to the work of the community that he has inaugurated. More than any other Gospel, Matthew's Gospel elaborates on the work of the Church, which is to continue after Jesus' death and resurrection.

Matthew uses the word *apostle* when referring to the Twelve Disciples. The word *apostle* means "one who is sent." In this context, Matthew is calling attention to the mission that the twelve disciples are being given. They are sent by Jesus to proclaim the kingdom of heaven in word and deed. As Jesus sent his disciples to continue his work and mission, so too the Church is sent by Jesus. The Church is his continuing presence on earth. Every member of the Church is sent by Jesus to contribute to this mission.

Last Sunday we celebrated the solemn Feast of the Eucharist. We reflected and meditated on how Jesus gave us his own body and blood to fill us with his life. Two Sundays ago, we celebrated the Feast of Pentecost, reminding us how we are filled and renewed by the Holy Spirit. This Sunday the Lord is "sending" us as apostles to become the Eucharist in the world. Through this year of Eucharistic revival, our parish community is called to be healed, converted, formed and unified by an encounter with Jesus in the Eucharist – and sent out in MISSION "for the life of the world."

Recently our parish revised our Mission and Vision Statement and I invite you all to make that statement a reality through our lives: "We are a dynamic faith community, truthful to Catholic teaching, spiritually nourishing, united in the Eucharist, reaching out and accompanying one another through engaging ministries, witnessing the gospel through the example of our lives."

May the Lord who called us give us the passion and strength to be his apostles in the world today.

Make sure it is clean. Please do not donate anything that is dirty, stained, or torn. We do not have the capacity to wash clothing before it is distributed, so make sure it's been washed before donating it (including athletic shoes).

Label bags and boxes. We ask that you put like items into one container and attach a brief description of the contents to the outside. Our sorting volunteers will thank you!
