REFLECTIONS FROM FR. MATTHEW

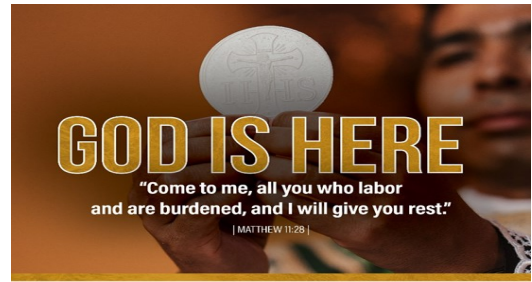
“Receive all as Christ”

Today’s readings call us to hospitality. The gospel invites us to receive others as we receive Christ. This hospitality goes beyond what we usually mean by the word, it is not about throwing parties, but rather a **hospitality of the heart**; it is about being willing to move around our very selves in order to make space for others. That’s why Jesus’ words about receiving others and offering cups of cold water are paired with those about taking up our crosses and losing our lives. This hospitality is about giving of ourselves, which is often uncomfortable. But Jesus is calling us to something deeper here. We do not give up our lives for no reason, but because in doing so we imitate the self-giving love of God. By making this space for others, we find our truest selves.

If in our lives we do prioritize the love of Jesus and his gospel, and if in doing this we have to painfully bid farewell to people who are precious to us, Jesus offers us a great welcome into a new “family” and community. The first reading shows a practice of this radical hospitality, the same kind to which we are called by the gospel. The Shunammite woman and her husband do not just provide for Elisha’s needs as is convenient for them. They rearrange their very lives and home to make space for him. In the end, this is what hospitality is all about – making space for others, in our homes, in our lives, and in our hearts.

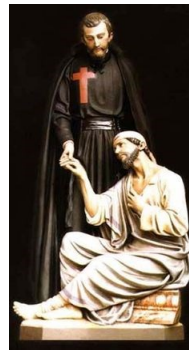
Many of us are adept at surface level hospitality; we know how to greet someone new, to make conversation, to be friendly. Many of us know how to open our homes to others, to create a pleasant experience and tend to the immediate needs of those who eat or sleep under our roofs. But Jesus asks us for something more; hospitality of the heart requires deeper vulnerability, radical generosity, and profound trust in God.

Jesus reminds us today that to welcome another person is to welcome God, the source of all life, and Christ’s very self. For all people are made in the image of God. God dwells within and among each one of us. The friend and the foe, the loved one and the stranger, the joyful, the hurting, the weary and the lost – everyone reflects the image of God in a unique way and deserves to be treated as such. Let us embrace this call to discipleship to **see Christ in others, to be Christ for others and to serve others as Christ served**. This is the best way to proclaim his gospel today.
