

REFLECTIONS FROM Fr. MATTHEW

"God's ways are far beyond the ways of human beings".

This week's readings highlight God's generosity. In the first reading we are told that God does not think the way we think. The psalm praises God's compassion, justice, and mercy. The second reading reminds us that we must labor to imitate Christ. And in the gospel Jesus tells the parable about the workers in the vineyard and the generous landowner who paid them all the same wage.

Isaiah 55:6-9, calls us to seek the Lord while He is near and to forsake our wicked ways. It reminds us that God's thoughts and ways transcend our own, just as the heavens are higher than the earth. This passage invites humility and a recognition of our limited perspective before the divine wisdom.

The Gospel we read today in Matthew 20:1-16, resonate a similar theme. The parable illustrates God's unfathomable generosity, where all workers, regardless of when they arrive, receive the same reward. Isaiah's message of God's transcendent thoughts finds its echo here. Just as the landowner's ways surpassed the laborers' expectations, God's mercy exceeds our understanding.

Both passages invite us to release our rigid notions of fairness and instead embrace God's vast, compassionate perspective. Just as the heavens dwarf the earth, God's grace surpasses human comprehension. This calls for a shift in our attitudes, from judgment to rejoicing in God's abundant love. The parable reminds us that although God owes us nothing, he offers abundantly and equally. We are occasionally tempted to think that our own actions deserve more reward, more of God's abundant mercy, than the actions of others. But God's generosity cannot be quantified or partitioned into different amounts for different people. When we think that way, we are trying to relate to God on our terms rather than to accept God's radically different ways. We are also warned through this parable not to be envious of the blessings of others, rather to praise and bless God for all that He generously provides us with, however small or little they are.

As we ponder Isaiah's words and the parable's message, we're called to humility and trust. We're urged to seek God earnestly and to relinquish our self-centered viewpoints. The divine economy of grace challenges us to let go of our limited sense of justice and instead embrace the boundless generosity of our Creator.

"Run to the feet of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. Kneel down and render the tribute of your presence and devotion to Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. Confide all your needs to him, along with those of others."

"Stay with me, Lord, because I need to have You present so as not to forget You. You know how easily I abandon you; Stay with me, Lord, because I am weak, and I need your strength so as not to fall so often; Stay with me, Lord, because you are my life, and without You, I am without fervor; Stay with me, Lord, because You are my light, and without You I am in darkness; Stay with me, Lord, to show me Your will; Stay with me, Lord, so that I can hear Your voice, and follow You; Stay with me, Lord, because I desire to love You ever more and to always be in Your company: Stay with me, Lord, if you want me to be always faithful to You; Stay with me, Lord, because my soul is so poor that it desires to be for You a site of consolation, an abode of love."
