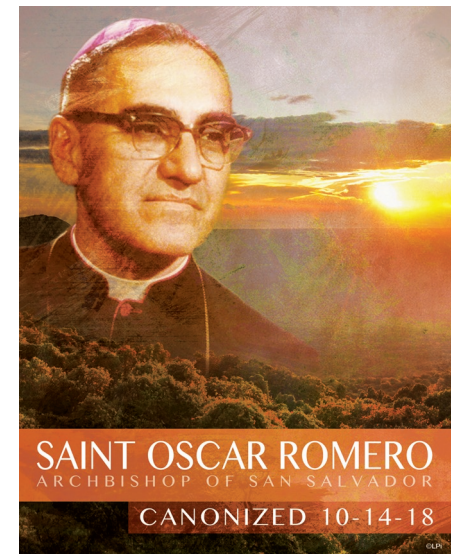
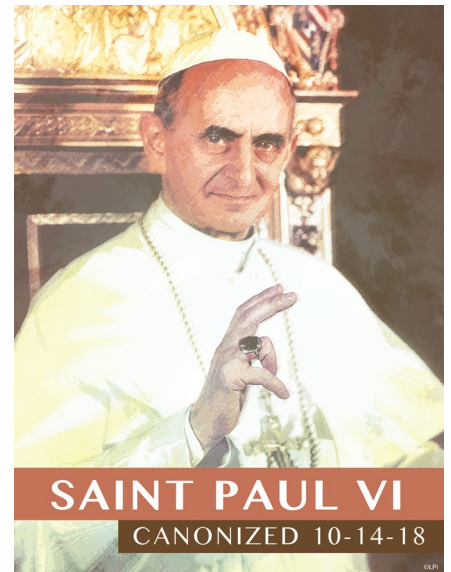

Reconciliation (Confession) is celebrated on the First Saturday of the month at 8:30 am at the 92nd Street site and at 3:00 pm on the 116th Street site. On the Third Saturday of the month at 3:30 pm at the 106th Street site.

Anointing of the Sick is celebrated communally on the First Saturday of the month after the evening mass at the 106th and 116th Street sites. Individual anointing may be requested by calling one of the parish priests.

Weddings Please call the Parish office to make arrangements no later than 6 months prior to your anticipated date. A process of preparation including participation in an Archdiocesan Engaged Encounter is required of all couples seeking marriage in the church.

FROM THE PASTORS' DESK

Dear Members of Mother of Perpetual Help,

This weekend, Pope Francis will canonize two figures who are well known to all of us who have been a part of the church since the 70's. Pope Paul VI, elected to succeed Pope St. John XXIII and Archbishop Oscar Romero who was martyred for the Faith in El Salvador. Paul VI was the pope of the Second Vatican Council. For years many have read his words on the Evangelization of the World and found inspiration as he sought to further the Church's dialog with the world. He was known to say that he felt called to be in "constant dialog with the world" so that it can clearly see the salvation that Jesus offers to and through His Church. His time as pope was not without controversy, just as the 60's and 70's produced quite a bit of social change and turmoil as well. He spent his entire life trying to engage people in the life of Christ and his church.

Archbishop Romero met his death as he celebrated mass one morning. Just a few days before, he spoke out against the right-wing military regime that was murdering thousands of innocent people, priests and religious. At a time of serious economic and violent repression, he reminded the soldiers that they were bound to a higher standard when their orders were immoral and in violation of human rights. 200,000 people attended his funeral and between 30-50 were shot by the military as they opened fire on the crowd that gathered to celebrate the life of their martyred shepherd. He was often a mystery, very quiet and pious in his personal life. He found an international pulpit calling for the rights of every human being to be respected and valued.

This next week from October 17-19 Fr. Thomas, Fr. Jeff and three parish members, Mary Maberry, our Council chair, Doug Barnes our Transition Team chair and Kathy Smith our Adult/Young Adult minister, will be attending the "Amazing Parish Conference" here in Milwaukee. This conference is a national effort aimed at improving the lives of people in their parishes. As a result, morning Mass will not be celebrated Thursday and Friday in our parish. Please join us for Communion services these two days. Soon, we will begin to share the insights we have gained from participating in the conference.
