Trivia Night Rules of the Game 2019

- 1) Doors open at 6 pm. Each team will be assigned one table. Competition will begin promptly at 7pm.
- 2) The Trivia competition will consist of 64 questions: 8 categories with 8 questions in each category. Questions will be read twice and scores will appear on the screen at the front of the room.
- 3) Maximum team size is 10 persons. If you are smart enough to go with less...so be it!

 Once a player has left the competition they will not be allowed to rejoin until the completion of the current round of questions. Children are welcome to attend and sit at your table as members of your team. Children may only attend if they are part of your team.
- 4) Pre-competition things to do:
 - a. Select a captain for your team. This person will be responsible for turning in your answer sheets.
 - b. Write your team name and table number on each of the answer sheets on your table.
 - c. On the 1st round answer sheet estimate how many correct answers you think your team will score of the 64 questions to be presented. In case of a tie for first place, the team with the closest estimated score without going over will be the winner.
 - d. 3 mulligans will be available for purchase, an envelope will be at each table to purchase mulligans and collected before play begins.
- 5) Correct spelling on the answer sheets is not required, however, answers must be legible and the judges must be able to easily recognize your answers. More than one answer per question will automatically be scored incorrect.
- 6) You will have three minutes between rounds to turn in your sheets to the judges table.
- 7) There will be a 20 minute intermission after round 4.
- 8) There is no polling the audience and no use any electronic devices. Resource materials and electronic devices are strictly prohibited at the tables. Should it be necessary for you to use your cell phone for a call, you are asked to leave the room and will not be permitted re-entry until the end of the round.
- 9) Judges will post team scores for all to see at the end of each round. The judges' committee has the final say on any disputed answers.
- 10) Keep your team discussions to a low roar or write your answers on a sheet of paper to pass to the other team members, unless you want the neighboring team to eavesdrop. Or discuss loudly the wrong answers and hope they will be eavesdropping. Anything goes. Team taunting is definitely allowed. And most importantly.... HAVE FUN!!!!
