
Opening Song: From Ashes to the Living Font


Liturgy of the Word

First Reading

Ezekiel 37:12-14

The prophet Ezekiel spoke to God's people during their exile in Babylon, six centuries before Christ. In today's passage, the prophet (using the image of death and resurrection) assures the people that God will one day bring them back to their homeland.

Psalm 130



The followers of Jesus live in the Spirit of God. The same Spirit who brought Jesus back to life will bring mortal bodies to life since God's Spirit dwells in them.

Gospel

John 11:1-45

The Apostles' Creed

I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, *[all bow]* who was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary,

suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended into hell; on the third day he arose again from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty; from there he will come to judge the living and the dead.

> I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.

Prayer of the Faithful

Presider: We believe that God always hears us, and so we have the confidence to express our needs and the needs of the world and believe that we will be heard.

1. For the Church, that in proclaiming God as the source of life within us we may recognize the sanctity of life within us all... let us pray to the Lord, Lord hear our prayer.

- 2. That leaders of the world may grow in wisdom and good judgment as they consider and discuss ways to care for all of us during this pandemic...let us pray to the Lord, Lord hear our prayer.
- 3. For strength and courage: that God will inspire all who are searching for treatments for the coronavirus or working to develop a vaccine for it...let us pray to the Lord, Lord hear our prayer.
- 4. For all who must face death each day, particularly emergency personnel, doctors, nurses, and hospital chaplains: that God will strengthen their spirits and help them honor the life of each person they assist...let us pray to the Lord, Lord hear our prayer.
- 5. For all of us, that we may roll away the stones that block us from becoming closer to God and assist others in unwrapping the burial bands that hold them in bondage... let us pray to the Lord, Lord hear our prayer.
- 6. For all living and deceased members of Mother of Perpetual Help parish...let us pray to the Lord, Lord hear our prayer.
- **Presider:** God of life, you are the source and the destiny of our lives. Kindle your Spirit within us and hear the prayers we offer through your Son, our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.
