

# **God's Word**

#### 2nd Sunday of Easter (Divine Mercy Sunday)/April 24, 2022

#### **First Reading:**

Yet more than ever, believers in the Lord, great numbers of men and women, were added to them. (Acts 5:14)

#### **Second Reading:**

"I am the first and the last, the one who lives. Once I was dead, but now I am alive forever and ever." (Rev 1:17-18)

#### Gospel:

On the evening of that first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came **3** and stood in their midst. (Jn 20:19)



## **Reflections from Fr. Matthew**

#### "As the Father has sent me, so I send you."

Today's Gospel reading combines two scenes: Jesus' appearance to his disciples after his Resurrection and Jesus' dialogue with Thomas, the disciple who doubted. Jesus greets his disciples with the gift of peace and the gift of the Holy Spirit. Jesus also commissions his disciples to continue the work that he has begun. As Jesus was sent by God, so too does Jesus send his disciples. This continuity with Jesus' own mission is an essential element of the Church. Jesus grants the means to accomplish this mission when he gives his disciples the gift of the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit binds us together as a community of faith and strengthens us to bear witness to Jesus' Resurrection.

Thomas, the disciple who doubts, represents the reality of the Church that comes after this first community of disciples. All but the first disciples of Jesus must believe without seeing. Like Thomas, we may doubt the news that Jesus, who was crucified and buried, appeared to his disciples. It is part of our human nature to seek hard evidence that the Jesus who appeared to the disciples after his death is, indeed, the same Jesus who was crucified. Thomas is given the opportunity to be our representative who obtains this evidence. He gives witness to us that the Jesus who was raised is the same Jesus who had died. Through the gift of the Holy Spirit, we are among those who are blessed for we have not seen and yet have believed.

Jesus' words to his disciples also highlight the integral connection between the forgiveness of sins and the gift of the Holy Spirit. Forgiveness and reconciliation are gifts to us from Jesus. With the grace of the Holy Spirit, we can share these with others. This is another essential aspect of what it means to be Christ's Church. The Church continues Jesus' ministry of forgiveness and reconciliation.

Today we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday to reflect on the gift of mercy and love given through Christ's death, burial, and resurrection. As Pope John Paul II stated, "Divine Mercy reaches human beings through the heart of Christ crucified." As we open our hearts to receive the mercy of God flowing from the wounded heart of Jesus for our sins, let us also be signs of God's mercy in the world.

# THE MASS

## THREE REALITIES OF THE MASS; A FEAST OF THE PASSOVER SUPPER, A SACRIFICE OF THE CROSS ON CALVARY AND A SACRAMENT OF THE LIVING CHURCH TODAY

The Mass; as feast, as sacrifice and as sacrament, is *"the source and summit of Christian life."* (Catechism of the Catholic Church, CCC 1324) and the pinnacle of our Catholic experience this side of heaven.

#### Feast of the Passover Supper

The celebration of the annual Passover feast, for a devout Jew, like Jesus, was a solemn and joyous event. This feast was the highlight of the year celebrated in every home with great reverence. The Passover meal, to this day, is understood not as a nostalgic recollection of a past event or just a good story, but rather as a remembrance in which to enter into the great act of the saving power of God in all of history. Jesus gives himself to the world in a most profound way through this timeless feast as a foretaste of heaven. *"Every time we celebrate the Eucharist, we participate in the Lord's supper which gives us a foretaste of the heavenly glory,"* (St. John Paul II)



### Sacrifice of the Cross on Calvary

The sacrifice of the Mass and the sacrifice of the cross are one and the same sacrifice. Jesus, who is also God, resides outside of time where the past and the future are always present. Thus, the historical events of Christ's death and resurrection are also forever eternal and made present by the power of God the Holy Spirit. The Mass, offered on our altar, in this church, unites us seamlessly into the mystery of the cross. At Mass, Christ is present on the cross and we are invited to receive the merits of his crucifixion, the gifts of salvation. We are also present to the resurrection of Jesus through this same grace of the Holy Spirit.

### Sacrament of the Living Church Today

We come to Mass each week. We are registered members of our parish. Is West Allis a better community because of us? Because of our parish? Each week we come together for the Eucharist, we enter into the Paschal Mystery; the passion, the death and the resurrection of Jesus. Our lives should be transformed to act as Christ in the world. "*Christ did not come into this world to merely change bread and wine into his body and blood, but to be lifegiving for our sake that we might transform the world.*" (St. Augustine) This is how Eucharist is a sacrament, "*we become what we receive.*" (St. Augustine) The Mass changes us to be the best version of the Christian family we can be. This is the difference that we make; that our parish makes in West Allis, we are transformed into the image of Christ.

God the Son is freely given to us at Mass, and we are participants in the ongoing work of redemption as we leave our church, living the mysteries of the Mass in our everyday life as sisters and brothers in Christ, daughters and sons of the Living God who live in faith, hope, and love with one another.
