

God's Word

5th Sunday of Lent/April 3, 2022

REFLECTIONS FROM FR. MATTHEW

"Go, and from now on do not sin anymore" (Jn 8:11)

The Gospel for the fifth Sunday of Lent continues to offer lessons about God's mercy and forgiveness. Last Sunday we heard the Parable of the Prodigal Son from the Gospel of Luke. Today we hear not a parable, but the report from John's Gospel of an encounter among Jesus, the scribes and Pharisees, and a woman caught in adultery.

The goal of the scribes and Pharisees was to trap Jesus and find evidence to arrest him and get rid of him. Jesus avoids the trap, however, by offering an answer that was not anticipated by those who posed the question. Jesus, after writing on the ground with his finger, addresses those who stand before him and suggests that the one without sin cast the first stone. We can easily imagine the scene as the Pharisees and the elders disperse, one by one. Jesus has eluded the trap they had prepared. Left alone with the woman, Jesus asks where the accusers have gone. With no one remaining to condemn the woman, Jesus (the one who truly is without sin) sends the woman on her way, refusing to pass judgment on her and exhorting her to avoid future sin.

Jesus challenges us on a number of levels, as it always seems easier to point out someone else's sins rather than recognizing our own need for conversion. Today's gospel foreshadows what we will experience next week in Holy Week. Just as Jesus transforms the situation with the woman from violence to forgiveness, he himself will show the life that springs from death. Jesus did not condemn but forgives, loves and welcomes.

Jesus' response to those who accuse the woman is more than a caution to us about making judgment of others. It is a profound lesson in divine mercy and forgiveness. As sinners, we are all unworthy to judge the sins of others and we would stand convicted by God for our transgressions. Yet Jesus, the one without sin and thus our judge, offers us who are sinners his mercy and forgiveness. Redeemed by Jesus' compassion, we are sent to sin no more and to live in God's love and peace. He tells the woman and each of us, "Go, and from now on do not sin any more". As we come to the end of this Lenten season, are we willing to extend the forgiveness Jesus offers to others? Perhaps more importantly, are we willing to accept Jesus' forgiveness ourselves?



THE MASS

HOLY COMMUNION

"Since the celebration of the Eucharist is the Paschal Banquet, it is desirable that in accordance with the Lord's command his Body and Blood should be received as spiritual food ..." (GIRM 2000 #80)

The Lord's Prayer

This prayer is used by Christians several times a day since it was given us by Jesus. It is most appropriate to prepare us to receive the "daily bread" we desire in the Eucharist. This is also a prayer of forgiveness and unity, uniting us as a community of "sons and daughters of God, brothers and sisters in Christ" as we call on God "Our Father."



The Sign of Peace

The Sign of Peace, "by which the Church entreats peace and unity for herself and for the whole human family ..." (GIRM 2000 #82).

The Fraction of the Bread

The breaking of the Eucharistic bread is done in the same manner as Jesus did at the Last Supper. As the bread is broken the priest will put a small piece of the sacred bread "into the chalice to signify the unity of the Body and Blood of the Lord in the work of salvation ..." (GIRM 2000 #83) The priest prays quietly; "May this mingling of the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ bring eternal life to us who receive it."

The people of God are united in this Fraction of the Bread as we sing, "Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world have mercy on us. Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world, grant us peace." just before we are invited to receive the sacred Body of Christ.

Holy Communion

The priest receives Holy Communion then distributes it to the faithful. With joy-filled hearts our procession to the altar for Holy Communion is accompanied by singing. The Mass is a great prayer of unity; the very word "Communion" reinforces that. We continue the tradition from the time of the Apostles to bring the Eucharistic Bread to the homebound and ill of our parish. Here, the ministers are invited to the altar by the deacon (priest), given the Sacred Bread to share, and then sent with our prayers to those who could not be with us at Mass. We, in turn, ask for their prayers also. The remaining consecrated bread is placed in the tabernacle and then the deacon (priest) purifies the sacred vessels and returns to the chair. We conclude the reception of Holy Communion with the **Prayer After Communion**.

THE CONCLUDING RITES

The priest says again, "The Lord be with you." The ritual phrase now serves as a farewell, followed by a blessing asking for the grace of God to be continuously present in our lives through our participation in the Mass.

The Blessing and Dismissal

The priest will bless the assembly with the Sign of the Cross +. With this final blessing, the Mass is ended. We leave our church with this mandate: to proclaim the Gospel of the Lord, nourished by the Eucharist. Our response is: "Thanks be to God."

We cannot stay here, although, like the apostles on the mountain of the Transfiguration, we may want to stay. It's natural to desire to hold onto times and places that bring blessing and peace. We must go out of this place, not empty-handed but strengthened with the Word of God we have heard, with the encouragement of one another united in worship and most importantly, we go transformed by the Body and Blood of Jesus that has fed us in Holy Communion.

The priest and other ministers will reverence the altar as a **Hymn** accompanies the procession out of church. This hymn is a further expression of our unity as a community of faith, being Christ in the world.




