Reflections from FR. MATTHEW

Baptism of Fire and the Cost of Discipleship (Lk 12:49-53)

"I have come to set the earth on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing! There is a baptism with which I must be baptized, and how great is my anguish until it is accomplished".

Jesus starts this weekend's gospel with the image of fire and blaze. It is a call to be consumed by the fire that was blazing within Jesus himself. Those who follow Jesus will not only be warmed and enlightened by him; inevitably, they will also feel the painful heat of their association with Jesus, including their relationships with family and friends. Jesus tells us, he is not speaking of an earthly peace, rather the final reconciliation of humanity with the peace of God.

The context of this intimate sharing is on the way to Jerusalem, where he will offer his life for the redemption of humanity. Remember how this journey in the gospel of Luke began. "When the days for Jesus' being taken up were fulfilled, he **Resolutely Determined** to journey to Jerusalem" (Lk 9:51). He is warning us, his disciples of the cost of discipleship and the passion and determination with which we should also take up this journey to Jerusalem, our heavenly promised land. It is significant that, in this gospel text, Jesus speaks so passionately not of extraordinary, dramatic suffering, but of the intimate, painful divisions and misunderstanding that the choice of discipleship can cause in families. A close and faithful relationship to Jesus will influence all our other relationships in terms of values and priorities.

Through the baptism of Jesus on Calvary, we are cleansed and purified and filled with the same fire of the Holy Spirit to "set the world on fire", the fire of love that is blazing in our hearts to purify the world from all its vices.

Assumption of the Blessed Mother August 15

The Assumption refers to the Blessed Virgin Mary being assumed - body and soul - into heaven at the end of her earthly life. It is by the power of God Mary was assumed.

This is the principal feast of Mary. It has a double purpose: first, the happy departure of Mary from this life and second, the assumption of her body into heaven.

Little for certain is known about the day, year and manner of Mary's death. The dates assigned for it vary between three and fifteen years after Jesus' Ascension.

Please note - Whenever August 15, the solemnity of the Assumption, falls on a Saturday or on a Monday, the obligation to attend Mass is lifted.
