

For those who may not know me, I am Becca Bojarski, the Director of Child & Youth Ministries. We offer programming for children 18 months old to 18 years old. This year, I am very excited to announce that Fr. Matthew Perumpil has been assigned our Parish Administrator. He comes to us with a fresh new vision to



increase the engagement of children and families within the parish. He has asked me to put together a short survey in order to obtain the opinions of the families that we serve. It will only take about 5 minutes of your time to complete.

I am currently working on the welcome letter, registration forms, and schedules for Religious Education (RE) classes and Sacramental preparation (1st Communion & Confirmation) that will be sent in the US mail at the end of August. RE is designed for students in public schools, to offer a Catholic faith foundation on Sundays during the school year. Students in Catholic school generally only meet for classes at the parish for sacramental preparation in 2nd grade (1st Communion) and 11th grade (Confirmation), as the students learn their Catholic faith foundation as part of their daily school curriculum. The Catholic School that MPH supports is Mary Queen of Saints Catholic Academy and Principal Nick Lee *(414-476-0751)* would love to discuss how MQSCA can accommodate your children's educational needs.

Assumption of Mary: History of the Doctrine



Belief that Mary has been taken up and is now in heaven with both her body and her soul has been part of the teaching of the Catholic Church since the earliest centuries of Christianity. The strongest evidence for the belief of the early Christians is found in ancient liturgies and in homilies in honor of Mary's passing. A second source, widely spread in the Middle Ages is known as the *Transitus* writings.

By the end of the Middle Ages, belief in Mary's Assumption into heaven was well established

theologically and part of the devotional expressions of the people. The word Assumption comes from the Latin verb *assumere*, meaning "to take to oneself." Our Lord, Jesus Christ took Mary home to himself where he is.

In the light of a long history of Christian belief since patristic times, in 1950,on November 1st, Feast of All Saints, Pope Pius XII defined Mary's Assumption into Heaven as a dogma of Roman Catholicism:

"the Immaculate Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heaven."

The proclamation of this dogma is found in the encyclical: *Munificentissimus Deus*.
