

REFLECTIONS FROM FR. MATTHEW

"Strive to enter through the narrow gate, for many, I tell you, will attempt to enter but will not be strong enough"

This Sunday's gospel opens with a reminder that Jesus is still journeying to Jerusalem, answering questions and telling stories along the way to explain what is expected of a disciple. "Lord will only a few people will be saved?" and Jesus answers that question with a parable, the parable of the narrow door. It's not a locked door, but one that requires efforts and discipline, a *spiritual training program* that will slim us down and enable us to pass through this door to the kingdom. Our second reading from Hebrews reminds us of the "discipline" we need for the spiritual Olympiad, in which suffering is part of our training, to win the medal of the kingdom.

Jesus is speaking this parable to his hearers who know about the Jerusalem city gate. Traditional city gates at the time typically had one large, central entrance arch and two smaller portals off to each side. Caravans of goods and livestock and camels used the main entryway, but travelers without a cart or baggage could avoid this main line and enter through the narrow side gates. In the context of this image, we can recognize that Jesus is not the one who limits who will be saved. We know that Jesus's salvation is offered to all. We also know however, that not everyone will accept this invitation. Our own baggage — our daily actions and lived reality, our possessions, our status — determine whether or not we can enter the narrow gate.

The second image in the gospel, the second door, is a locked one. The door to the kingdom of God will not remain open forever. There comes a time when, for each one of us personally in death, and cosmically at the second coming of Christ, the door will be closed. Jesus makes it clear, just by the name of being a follower of Christ, we will not enter the kingdom. Only by making individual efforts, a disciplined spiritual training, even going through suffering and pain, we can enjoy the messianic banquet we heard in the prophesy of Isiah today in the first reading.

Therefore, the answer to the question if only a few will be saved is no. In the end, many will be saved, but many who thought they would be saved will not be saved. The parable is a prophetic warning to repentance in order to enter the kingdom.

It is no surprise that scam artists are constantly searching for new ways to swindle people out of money. One easy way for scam artists to trick unsuspecting victims in through telemarketing scams. According to the AARP, here are seven current scam calls you should *always* hang up on.

- 1. Health Testing Services. Example: "I'm calling from Genetic Testing Services. Your doctor reached out to us because he is concerned with the cancer that runs in your family. We can test you for this, but need your Medicare number to cover the cost of the test." Never give out your Medicare number or insurance information unless you place the call first.
- 2. Computer Company. Example: "I am calling from Apple, we found malware on your phone. We need you to download AnyDesk so we can remove that virus for you." Never download something suggested by someone who calls you. That may put a virus on your device, allowing the scam artist to steal your information.
- 3. IRS Scam. Example: "This is the IRS and I am calling to inform you of a federal arrest warrant for not paying your taxes." Please note: real IRS employees will never demand money or threaten you over the phone. They may call to set up appointments or discuss audits, but only after trying to notify you by mail first.
- 4. Grandparent Scam. Example: "Hi Grandma, it's me. I got into some trouble and need \$800 for bail money. Please don't tell Mom and Dad, I need your help." Never wire money, always ask for their name, and inform others of the situation.
- 5. Imposter Scams (Amazon). Example: "This is Amazon Security there was an attempt to order items on your account. We can get you a refund, I just need a few pieces of information to get this started." If you think there is an actual problem with your Amazon account, go directly through Amazon and never through someone who calls you first.
- **6. Energy Company.** Example: "This is We Energies you have missed 2 payments and your electricity will be shut off by end of today unless you pay immediately over the phone." Utility shutoffs aren't handled this way you would get a notification in the mail.
- 7. Social Security Check Freeze: "This is the Social Security Administration and your Social Security check has been frozen due to fraudulent activity, press 1 to take care of this." Remember, federal or state government officials will not ask you to pay over the phone.

In summary, if you feel suspicious about a call, do not provide personal information and just hang up. You can do your own research and contact the company/person calling you if you'd like to follow up on it.
