

REFLECTIONS FROM Fr. MATTHEW

Practicing the Virtue of Humility

The entirety of Christian message can be summarized by Jesus's words in today's gospel: "Everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted". This is the message of the CROSS through which Jesus saved us. Christ gives us a model of how we must lower ourselves so as not to cling to power or riches but to find strength in humility and lowliness.

The gospel opens with a well-known parable of the last being first. The first reading from Sirach lays down what it means to be humble. Someone who is humble is "loved more than a giver of gifts". The readings today invite us to reflect on the virtue of humility. In our culture humility is not often mentioned as something we should seek. A humble person is not often seen as a strong person. More often we think humility is equivalent to meekness or submissiveness. But the scriptures remind us that humility is the basis of wisdom and a sure foundation for life.

There are three lessons we can learn from Christian understanding of humility:

First, Humility enables us to be grounded in Truth about who God is and to be open to the splendor of God in our lives. **Second**, Humility is present when we know who we are and understand God's role in our lives. **Third**, Humility is directly related to our relationship to other people and our responsibilities. It's a call to be dependent on God and one another.

In the gospel today, Jesus places this teaching in the context of a banquet where the host is asked to invite guests who are vulnerable and poor who may not repay us with anything. Christ's invitation to humility and vulnerability is grounded in self-knowledge. This concept is difficult to grasp because it seems to go against everything within us. Rather than climbing up the ladder of power and prestige, wealth and success, Christ invites us to descend, to lower ourselves, to understand and welcome our own weakness and wounds. Instead of exalting ourselves, Christ invites us to follow his example and humble ourselves.

We have a great example in Mary when she exclaimed "My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord...for he has looked with favor on his **lowly servant**....He has cast down the mighty from their thrones and has lifted up the **lowly**". Let us ask for grace and strength to practice the virtue of humility and become the true disciples of Christ.

MPH Community Meal Program Involvement
MPH is an active volunteer participant in 2 Meal
Programs in Metro Milwaukee:

St. Ben's Community Meal run by the Capuchins and Crossroads Kitchen run by St. Vincent de Paul.

Both currently serve over 200 at their hot meal sit-down dinners (Crossroads begins in-person dining in September) and St. Ben's an additional 150 in their take-home meal given out on Fridays.

Volunteers are always needed for serving at both sites and for preparing meals.

St. Ben's: we serve on 3rd Mondays-carpool leaves at 4pm from the 106th parking lot by the gym. We prepare bag dinners for 3rd & 4th Fridays on the Thursday before. (8-9am and 2-4pm).

Crossroads: we prepare and serve on 5th Fridays and 5th Sundays. Preparing is 3-5pm; serving is 5-6:30 PM and carpooling is available from 116th St. by the Bethany Outreach Center.
