Reflections from Fr. Matthew

"Where your treasure is, there will your heart be"

This weekend the readings continue to guide us to reflect on our life and how we are to journey with the eyes of faith to our heavenly homeland. We are not to be like the greedy rich man in last Sunday's Gospel who planned to store his great harvest in barns rather than share it with those in need. Jesus wants us to be **vigilant** and place our treasure in heaven where it will not wear out or be destroyed.

In today's Gospel Jesus is reminding us to be **watchful**, like servants waiting for the master's return from a wedding banquet. We must be watchful so that even if the master comes after midnight, we will be ready for him – a great imagery of how we should be prepared for the Lord any time he calls us to our eternal home after our earthly journeys.

Peter asks if this parable is meant for the apostles or for the large crowd that has gathered to listen to Jesus. Without answering Peter's question, Jesus responds with another parable about servants awaiting the return of their master. It begins with a question: "Who, then, is the faithful and prudent steward whom the master will put in charge of his servants to distribute the food allowance at the proper time?" This parable adds to the theme of watchfulness; it explains how to wait and reminds us of the reward for the faithful follower at the heavenly banquet after the judgment. If we are doing our jobs, our reward will be great. But if we relax, neglect our duties, and begin to act like the greedy rich man-eating, drinking, and making merry-we will not have a place in the kingdom. Watchfulness means living in such a consistently moral and obedient way that we are always ready to give an account to God of how we have lived.

The second reading today tells us how we have to walk in faith like Abraham did and reach our promised land – heaven. Saint Paul tell us through faith, we can possess, even now, what we hope for – our eternal reward and do not worry about judgment. That is why Jesus assures us today, **"Do not be afraid any longer, little flock, for your Father is pleased to give you the Kingdom"** (Lk 12:32).

and have now found permanent or temporary housing here

lives. We continue with our connections with social
workers and health clinics. As a result we have helped
nearly 30 families so far this summer alone!
