



# God's Word

# 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time / August 8, 2021

#### First Reading:

He got up, ate, and drank; then strengthened by that food, he walked forty days and forty nights to the mountain of God, Horeb. (1 Kgs 19:8)

# A NOTE FROM FR. MATTHEW PERUMPIL, MI

"No one can come to me unless the Father who sent me draw him......They shall be taught by God. Everyone who listens to my Father and learns from him comes to me".

On this Sunday, we continue to read from the "Bread of Life discourse" found in from it for another two. Last week, the crowd asked for a sign that would show that Jesus came from God. Jesus replied by saying that he is the sign and the bread of life sent by God.

As we continue reflecting on this Gospel, Jesus reminds us we are drawn to Him by the Father. How blessed we are to be drawn to Jesus by the Father? It is a gift, not a rational choice we make for Jesus. It is a faith response. Prompted by the Father we get drawn to Jesus and get nourished by Him, who feeds us with His own life. We experience this at every Mass we participate. Our coming together as a worshiping community is an affirmation of this gift of faith we received from our loving Father. At the Eucharistic table we get fed by the "Bread of Life", the Son of God sent to redeem us.

The second part of today's Gospel, Jesus reminds us, quoting the prophets, "we will be taught by God". Just imagine how privileged we are in having Jesus teach us about the mysteries of faith. As we listen to the Word of God and as we reflect prayerfully its application in our lives we get transformed into a new being, enlightened and nourished to live a more abundant life pleasing to God and to one another.

He promises that the bread of life will bring eternal life to those who partake of it, and he tells us that the bread of life will be his own flesh, given for the life of the world. Let us be grateful for this great promise and gift which we are privileged to partake as we celebrate the Eucharist. Let us draw others to Jesus so that as we journey towards eternal life, we may also bring others with us to Him.

Jesus, Teach us and Lead us to the Father.

For those who may not know me, I am Becca Bojarski, the Director of Child & Youth Ministries. We offer programming for children 18 months old to 18 years old. This year, I am very excited to announce that Fr. Matthew Perumpil has been assigned our Parish Administrator. He comes to us with a fresh new vision to



increase the engagement of children and families within the parish. He has asked me to put together a short survey in order to obtain the opinions of the families that we serve. It will only take about 5 minutes of your time to complete.

I am currently working on the welcome letter, registration forms, and schedules for Religious Education (RE) classes and Sacramental preparation (1<sup>st</sup> Communion & Confirmation) that will be sent in the US mail at the end of August. RE is designed for students in public schools, to offer a Catholic faith foundation on Sundays during the school year. Students in Catholic school generally only meet for classes at the parish for sacramental preparation in 2<sup>nd</sup> grade (1<sup>st</sup> Communion) and 11<sup>th</sup> grade (Confirmation), as the students learn their Catholic faith foundation as part of their daily school curriculum. The Catholic School that MPH supports is Mary Queen of Saints Catholic Academy and Principal Nick Lee (414-476-0751) would love to discuss how MQSCA can accommodate your children's educational needs.


