Celebrating the Sacraments

Baptism is celebrated during or after Mass on the second and fourth Sunday of the month. Other times may be arranged by calling one of the priests. A Baptismal preparation class is required. Classes will be held quarterly in 2019, so it is recommended you schedule a class early, possibly before your child is born. Please call the parish office to register for the class and the Baptism.

Reconciliation (Confession) is celebrated on the First Saturday of the month at 8:30 am at the 92nd Street site and at 3:00 pm on the 116th Street site.

Anointing of the Sick is celebrated communally on the First Saturday of the month after the evening mass at the 116th Street site. Individual anointing may be requested by calling one of the parish priests.

Weddings Please call the Parish office to make arrangements no later than 6 months prior to your anticipated date. A process of preparation including participation in an Archdiocesan Engaged Encounter is required of all couples seeking marriage in the church.

Dear Members of Mother of Perpetual Help,

We would like to share two pieces of information this week. The First concerns our Lenten outreach and the second, our planning process.

THE WATER PROJECT

This year, Sr. Jan's Water Project in Guatemala will share in our Lenten almsgiving. Sr. will be present at our parish masses on the weekend of March 2-3. On March 9-10 and 16-17 we will have a second collection to help provide drinking water to the people of Guatemala. We look forward to welcoming this special effort to each of our sites as a part of our Lenten Almsgiving.

THE PLANNING PROCESS

As we pass the half year mark of our Parish Merger Process, we are looking ahead to the future of our parish family. We are almost finished with the Parish Registration Process in which the Evangelization Committee of our Transition Team has tried to reach out to every unregistered household from our three former parishes.

We are also planning to initiate various efforts to take stock of our current ministries. The recent call to all Liturgical Ministers to renew their current Commitments and for those who have moved on to a new mass time to minister at a different site is the first of these efforts.

Christian Formation, especially in the form of the Day school, Mary Queen of Saints Catholic Academy, has also been on our minds. The School community, in conjunction with the Archdiocesan Office for Schools and the Seton School Administration, has been testing various ideas for the future growth of the West Allis/West Milwaukee campus, now located at the former St. Aloysius building.

Please read your next monthly mailing carefully to hear of updates regarding future Christian Formation projects regarding the grade school.

The Food Pantry was open 1,776.5 hours and 2994 people were served.



YOU ARE CORDIALLY INVITED

Lent is fast approaching (Ash Wednesday is March 6). Consider making an hour of Eucharistic Adoration each week of Lent and spend time with Jesus.

Mother Teresa (St. Teresa of Calcutta) says, "If I can give you any advice, I beg you to get closer to the Eucharist and to Jesus. . .We must pray to Jesus to give us that tenderness of the Eucharist. People ask me: 'What will convert America and save the world?' My answer is prayer. What we need is for every parish to come before Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament in Holy Hours of Prayer. The Eucharist involves more than just receiving; it also involves satisfying the hunger of Christ.

He says, 'Come to Me.' He is hungry for souls."

"I THIRST"

Mother Teresa's understanding of Jesus' cry, "I thirst" (Jn. 19:28) on the cross was very deep, but also really simple. She was thoroughly convinced that beyond his human thirst, Jesus was expressing a deeper, divine "thirst" for a relationship with us. "At this most difficult time He proclaimed, "I thirst." And people thought He was thirsty in an ordinary way and they gave Him vinegar straight away; but it was not for that thirst; it was for our love, our affection, that intimate attachment to Him, and that sharing of His passion. He used, "I thirst," instead of "Give Me your love."

In her lifetime of dedicated love for and service to the poor, Mother Teresa always stressed the importance of prayer, especially Eucharistic Adoration. During her instructions to her community of Sisters and during her messages to youth and adult gatherings, she said, "Seek wholeheartedly to love God and long to find Him. In this way you satiate the thirst of God who thirsts for us to thirst for Him."

RESPONSE

We are fortunate here at Mother of Perpetual Help Parish (S. 106th St. site) to have Eucharistic Adoration each week from Monday through Thursday from 8:00 AM to 9:00 PM in the Chapel.

The hour you spend with Jesus is spent any way you want. You may bring your own prayer books, use the books in the Chapel, read the Bible, pray the Rosary, pray the Stations of the Cross, or just sit and enjoy the peace that comes from simply being in God's Presence. You may feel you can't pray well. Don't let this discourage you. The mere fact that you take specific time each week to spend with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament pleases Him very much, and is in itself a prayer of great faith.
