## REFLECTIONS FROM FR. MATTHEW

### “Who Is My Neighbor?” *Everyone*

These weeks of Summer we have been reflecting on our journey with Jesus to Jerusalem, our call to be his disciples and how we share his mission to the whole world starting with the people around us and in our neighborhood. Today’s gospel gives us the “modus-operandi” of how we get this mission implemented – by becoming a neighbor to one another.

The Parable of the Good Samaritan explains the great commandment of love in the most practical expression of “*becoming a neighbor to the other*”. This is one of the most memorable and powerful parables in all of the gospels summarizing everything Jesus is trying to teach us. The details of the story have everything in it for us to reflect, meditate and apply into our lives to become the true disciple of Jesus and leading others to Jesus.

We are invited to imagine all roles we play in our lives through this story. We may be the beaten and wounded man helped by a stranger. We may have been the Samaritan many times in our lives, helping another person in need. We may have been the priest or the Levite who saw something happen and kept walking away. The brilliance of this story is that humanity is expressed in all of the characters, those who offer help and those who turn away. We will, at different points in our life, be each of these characters. The goal, of course, is to be the Samaritan.

Another striking character in the story is the innkeeper. He is told to take care of the man and given the resources to do so until the Samaritan returns. Isn’t Jesus telling us that we are all innkeepers, entrusted by him with the care of the wounded, asked to respond to the call of becoming a neighbor to one another? Reflect also the image of the inn where the wounded man was brought by the Samaritan. Isn’t it the Church where all the broken and wounded are welcomed and cared by us the “innkeepers”? When our church becomes the inn and our parish community become the neighbors to one another we fulfill the mission of the Lord.

## Mission Appeal Weekend

Fr. Martin Laumann, a priest-son of St. Aloysius and currently serving as a missionary in Manaus Brazil will be visiting our parish next weekend for the Mission Appeal.

He went as a missionary to Brazil in 1977. For the last 40 years, he was working in the Amazon River area with the native communities. At present, Fr. Martin is working in an area called Manaquiri, where there are 37 basic Christian communities. He visits them when river conditions permit, forming leaders, ministers of the Word and Eucharist. Let us support his mission with our generosity and prayers.
