

REFLECTIONS FROM Fr. MATTHEW

Listening and Serving the Lord

The story of Jesus in the home of Martha and Mary complements the story of the Good Samaritan, which immediately precedes it in Luke's Gospel. Both stories are unique to Luke. The Samaritan is an example of how a disciple should **see and act**. Mary is an example of how a disciple should **listen**. Both stories exemplify how a disciple is to fulfill the dual command of love of God (Mary) and love of neighbor (the Samaritan). These are the two essentials of life in the kingdom and the qualities of a disciple.

In our gospel today, we find Jesus coming to his friend's house. He wants to spend some time in the presence of his friends. Martha is so busy hosting Jesus and his disciples with all the cooking and the details of making the guests happy. Martha was so consumed with all her works that she forgot the bigger picture that it was the Lord she was hosting and she needs to spend some quality time listening and sharing with him. She even feels her sister Mary is not helping her in her tasks of hosting the Lord and complains.

In response to Martha's complaint that her sister Mary is not helping her, Jesus reminds her why he is at their house. To share his life with them and to listen to them. That's why Jesus tells Martha that Mary has chosen the better part. Jesus is not minimizing the importance of hospitality and welcoming, but rather he is inviting Martha to reflect on balancing the active and contemplative life of a disciple. Jesus wants to be with us, to be in relationship with us, to love us. He wants to let us know how much God cares about us. Hospitality and work have their place, but Jesus urges us to have them properly aligned to the purpose and bigger picture.

Jesus reminds us through this incident the purpose and source of our lives – to remain present and attentive to the words, the presence, and the love of the God who became man. When God is present everything else will fall in its right place. Let us welcome Jesus to our homes, lives and host him with our attentive listening.

Celebrating the Sacraments

<u>Weddings</u> Please call the Parish office to make arrangements no later than 6 months prior to your anticipated date. A process of preparation including participation in an Archdiocesan Engaged Encounter is required of all couples seeking marriage in the church.
