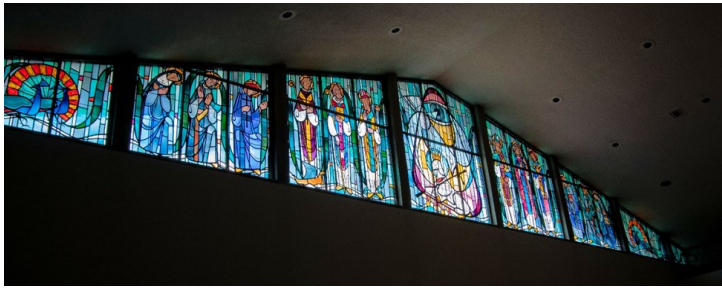
WORLD DAY FOR GRANDPARENTS AND THE ELDERLY
