

REFLECTIONS FROM Fr. Matthew

"Take care to guard against all greed... one's life does not consist of possessions"

The gospel this week begins with a question to Jesus from a man in the crowd who tries to draw him into an inheritance dispute with his brother. But Jesus refuses to intervene and questions him about greed. Jesus uses this opportunity to teach him and us about life and our attitude toward wealth by the parable of the Rich Fool.

The man is introduced as already rich, and his lands have yielded more crops than expected. His response is not to consider how he might share all the extra food with others but to wonder how he can possibly store it all. He has what he thinks is a brilliant idea: to tear down his present barns and build larger ones. Then he will have many things stored up for years of eating. drinking, and making merry. He does not see that this blessing is from God. His "retirement plan" is a self-centered recital of "I will," well punctuated by references to "my". The rich man considers he owns everything: crops, barns, grains, and even his own soul. Jesus tells the crowd a parable.

"You fool" is God's response to this man because that very night his life will be taken away. To whom will everything belong then, God asks. The rich man's world is small, just him and his possessions, and now he learns that he is to lose his life. What good are his possessions now? Jesus states the moral of the story. This is how it will be for everyone who stores up treasure for himself or herself but is not rich in what matters to God. Jesus reminds us through this story, "Take care to guard against all greed, for though one may be rich, one's life does not consist of possessions".

If we are to combat greed, it is important to evaluate what we treasure and value. Jesus invites us to look at this example and reflect on our own lives. What are we looking for? What will satisfy us? Nothing can satisfy us except our relationship with God. When we come to realize that God is our greatest treasure, we begin to notice that material things are not as important. Likewise, when we recognize that relationship with God is our deepest longing, we come to know that part of this relationship is caring for others by sharing the gifts God has given us. Life does not consist in possessions but in sharing what we possess with others.
