

Celebrating the Sacraments

<u>Baptism</u> is celebrated during or after Mass on the second and fourth Sunday of the month. Other times may be arranged by calling one of the priests. A Baptismal preparation class is required. Classes will be held quarterly in 2019, so it is recommended you schedule a class early, possibly before your child is born. Please call the parish office to register for the class and the Baptism.

Reconciliation (Confession) is celebrated on the First Saturday of the month at 8:30 am at the 92nd Street site and at 3:00 pm on the 116th Street site.

Anointing of the Sick is celebrated communally on the First Saturday of the month after the evening mass at the 116th Street site. Individual anointing may be requested by calling one of the parish priests.

<u>Weddings</u> Please call the Parish office to make arrangements no later than 6 months prior to your anticipated date. A process of preparation including participation in an Archdiocesan Engaged Encounter is required of all couples seeking marriage in the church.

God's Word

Relationships — even genetic ones — are a mystifying reality, and the best efforts to explain them are often poetic. They are often described in terms of their results, as in today's readings on this celebration of God as a community. God's love, peace, truth and hope deepen our relationship to one another, the Earth, and all creatures. We don't need to understand this, only to believe and live it.

Prv 8:22-31 Wisdom precedes, accompanies and reflects God in creation.

Rom 5:1-5 Our faith, even in suffering, brings peace and hope.

Jn 16:12-15 Jesus connects his teachings to the Spirit and the Father.

From The Pastors' Desk

The mystery of the most Holy Trinity is a basic doctrine of Faith in Christianity, understandable not with our heads but with our hearts. It teaches us that there are three distinct Persons in one God, sharing the same Divine Nature. Our mind cannot grasp this doctrine which teaches that 1+1+1=1 and not 3. But we believe in this Mystery because Jesus who is God taught it clearly, the Evangelists recorded it, the Fathers of the Church tried to explain it and the Councils of Nicaea and Constantinople defined it as a dogma of Christian Faith.

Importance in Christian life:

- 1) All prayers in the Church begin in the Name of the Holy Trinity and end glorifying the Trinity.
- 2) All Sacraments are administered (we are baptized, confirmed, anointed, our sins are forgiven, and our marriage blessed, and our Bishops, priests and deacons ordained) in the name of the Holy Trinity.
- 3) Where Church bells ring thrice daily, they remind us to pray to the Holy Trinity.
- 4) We bless ourselves, and the priest blesses us, in the name of the Holy Trinity.

Biblical Basis:

There are only vague and hidden references to the Trinity in the Old Testament. But the New Testament gives clear teachings on the Holy Trinity.

- At the Annunciation, God the Father sends His angel to Mary, God the Holy Spirit overshadows her and God the Son becomes incarnate in her womb.
- 2) At the baptism of Jesus, when the Son receives baptism from John the Baptist, the Father's Voice is heard and the Holy Spirit appears as a Dove.
- 3) At the Ascension, Jesus gives the missionary command to his disciples to baptize those who believe, in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.
- 4) In John, chapters 15-18, we have a detailed account of Jesus' teaching of the role of each Person of the Holy Trinity:
 - a) God the Father creates and provides for His creatures.
 - b) God the Son redeems us and reconciles us with God.
 - c) God the Holy Spirit sanctifies us, strengthens us, teaches us and guides us to God.

Life Messages:

- Let us respect ourselves and others because everyone is the temple of the Holy Spirit where all Three Persons of the Holy Trinity abide.
- 2) Let us have the firm conviction that the Trinitarian God abides in us, that He is the Source of our hope, courage and strength and that He is our final destination.

Sat. June 1st, the outside temp was about 56 degrees. It was soooo cold at 4pm Mass, everyone was very uncomfortable. Why on earth would the air conditioning be on? The usher said they cannot do anything because it's controlled by an outside source on computer. Why would the church agree to have a system like that? That's ridiculous

and you are paying a high air conditioning bill on a cold day. If anything, why not communicate with those who control it to turn it off? Can't that at least be done? It should be controlled on the premises. Doesn't that make sense?

First of all, the air conditioning was not on. The heat, however, was off. The buildings are not heated after June 1st. What happened was the control system was calling for more outside air as the church started to fill up. Since the heat was off, the church temperature had already dropped. It is possible that there was a "hot spot" in the church and the air was self-activated, but that should not have happened with the warmer temp outside. The system is controlled by computer. The computer is onsite and is checked quarterly and again when the heat and air conditioning are activated.
