

REFLECTIONS FROM FR. MATTHEW

"As the Father has sent me, so I send you."

The season of Easter concludes with today's celebration, the feast of Pentecost. On Pentecost we celebrate the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles gathered in the upper room in Jerusalem. This event marks the beginning of the Church.

The feast of Pentecost, reminds us about the integral connection between the gifts of peace and forgiveness and the action of the Holy Spirit. Jesus greets his disciples with the gift of peace. Jesus then commissions his disciples to continue the work that he has begun, "As the Father has sent me, so I send you." As he breathes the Holy Spirit upon them, Jesus sends his disciples to continue his work of reconciliation through the forgiveness of sins.

This Gospel reminds us that the Church is called to be a reconciling presence in the world. This reconciling presence of Christ is celebrated in the Church's sacramental life. In the Sacrament of Baptism, we are washed clean from sin and become a new creation in Christ. In the Sacrament of Penance, the Church celebrates the mercy of God in forgiving sins. This reconciling presence is also to be a way of life for Christians. In situations of conflict, we are to be agents of peace and harmony among people. First and foremost, this peace has to be experienced within us and in our parish community.

I believe this is how we become a powerful evangelizing presence in West Allis as a Parish Community. I have been with you as your shepherd for almost a year now. I truly believe it was the Holy Spirit who led me here and guided me throughout this year. We have been through some rough times in the past years. But the Holy Spirit was guiding us through those painful times.

Today we are commissioning new members to our Pastoral Council, a great symbol of our new beginning as a Parish Community. Let us pray together as the first disciples with Mary, Mother of Perpetual Help, Patroness of our Parish, for the outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon us. Let us pray to the Holy Spirit to help us set aside all that divides us and to unite us in the love of Christ. May we, as a parish community, be like the early Christian community spreading the Gospel of Love around us.

GOSPEL MEDITATION ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

June 5, 2022 Pentecost Sunday

Even though Pentecost is rightly celebrated in late spring, the robust experience of a New England fall can provide a profound metaphor for reflection. A full expression of fall colors is beautiful to behold. But, with all of its majesty and beauty, the observer knows the experience of death is soon to come. Creation will be dark and barren for a while. Pentecost cannot be separated from the cross.



Before God's transformative, life-giving power can bear fruit, we must first die.

Pentecost is all about leaving the lifeless dead wood behind and allowing God, through the power of the Holy Spirit, to create something new. These Pentecost creations happen repeatedly over and over again. The birthing process of the Church is ongoing. God is always bringing life out of death and creating something where there was once nothing. That is why the fall is such an apropos metaphorical season for Pentecost. In order to really receive the gift of the Holy Spirit we have to die to what we once knew and what no longer works.

When fire and wind find their fullest expression, they are in no way gentle nor kind. They have the potential to level anything in their paths. We are experiencing great turmoil in our world, nation, and our Church. Whether the result of circumstance or the work of the Holy Spirit, much of what we knew to be normal and constant is changing. Common systems and institutional structures that may have worked for a time no longer do. When the old and familiar need to be left behind, God creates something new. Change and disorder do not need to be our enemies. They always bring opportunities for something exciting and new. What we need is untiring faith, firm hope, and perfect love.

What we need is for the Holy Spirit to enlighten us to see what is important and what we must do. "O Holy Spirit, descend plentifully into my heart. Enlighten the dark corners of this neglected dwelling and scatter there Thy cheerful beams." (St. Augustine) If we experience joy, even in the midst of turbulence, then we will know we are exactly where God needs us to be. If not, then perhaps there is a lesson in the decaying leaves that graciously descend to the ground on a crisp fall day.

Adults: Do you want to make your life complete? Consider doing as Saint Mother Teresa of Calcutta said: "When you help the poor, you **find yourself."** We are inviting you to help feed those who need a meal on the South Side, including many who are homeless. Our MPH St. Vincent DePaul Conference helps to prepare a community meal at the SVDP Crossroads Kitchen every 5th Friday and 5th Sunday (5th Fridays & Sundays usually occur four times/year each). We gather at our MPH's Bethany Outreach Center at our West Site at 2:00 PM to join in praying the Rosary. This prayer time helps us to focus, and it is optional. At 2:30 we carpool to Crossroads Meal Program at 9th and Madison, and together with the staff in the kitchen, prepare eight large casseroles for about 200 guests. Preparing the meal takes about two hours and this group returns to the Bethany Outreach Center at about 5:30 PM.

Not interested in preparing food but would like to serve it? We have an opportunity for that too! On the same 5th Fridays and 5th Sundays, beginning in July (watch the bulletin), we will be serving food for Crossroads Kitchen from 5:15 PM to 6:30 PM. The carpool will leave the West Site parking lot near the Bethany Outreach Center building at 4:30 PM and return at approximately 7 PM. We need 10 volunteers for serving and families are welcome. June 9th is our K5 graduation at 10:00am.


June 10th is our last day of school, mass will be at 9:30 with 10:30 dismissal.
