This membership also includes an opportunity to donate to the layette ministry. We ask for one dollar, but any amount can be donated. It helps the charities, who Milwaukee Archdiocese Council of Christian Women, choose to receive both infant and toddler items and monetary funds. This year the charities were: Women's Support Center of Milwaukee, Life Connection of Waukesha & Mukwonago, Alliance Women's Clinic of Racine & Kenosha, and Charias of Fond du Lac.
