God's Word

2nd Sunday of Lent/ March 13, 2022

First Reading:

It was on that occasion that the LORD made a covenant with Abram, saying: "To your descendants I give the land, from the Wadi of Egypt to the Great River, the Euphrates." (Gn 15:18)

Second Reading:

He will change our lowly body to conform with his glorified body by the power that enables him also to bring all things into subjection to himself. (Phil 3:21)

Gospel:

Jesus took Peter, John, and James and went up the mountain to pray. While he was praying his face changed in appearance and his clothing became dazzling white. (Lk 9:28b-29)

REFLECTIONS FROM Fr. Matthew

"This is my chosen Son; Listen to him"

On the second Sunday of Lent, we move from Jesus' retreat to the desert and temptation to the glory shown in Jesus' Transfiguration. On the first Sunday of Lent, our Gospel always tells the story of Jesus' temptation in the desert. On the second Sunday, we always hear the story of Jesus' Transfiguration. The Transfiguration occurs after Peter's confession that Jesus is the Messiah and Jesus' prediction about his Passion. After the prediction there is a discussion of the cost of discipleship.

The Transfiguration occurs on a mountain in the presence of just three of Jesus' disciples—Peter, James and John. These are among the first disciples that Jesus called in Luke's Gospel. Only Luke's Gospel, which often describes Jesus at prayer, indicates that Jesus is praying as his appearance changes to bright white. Luke indicates that the three disciples were sleeping while Jesus prayed. They will be sleeping again as Jesus prays in the Garden of Gethsemane before his Passion and death. What an interesting way we are reminded of these journeys of the disciples and often ours too.

As they awake, Peter and the disciples see Jesus Transfigured and Elijah and Moses present with Jesus. Elijah and Moses, both significant figures in the history of Israel, represent Jesus' continuity with the Law and the Prophets. The disciples hear the conversation Jesus had with Moses and Elijah. Luke describes this as his exodus, connecting Jesus' Passion, death, and Resurrection with Israel's Exodus from Egypt. Then the disciples hear a voice from heaven speaks, affirming Jesus as God's Son and commanding that the disciples listen to him. They are awed at this great experience and Peter wanted to pitch a tent there, but Jesus leads them down to continue his mission.

Lent is this beautiful time to go up the mountain, be with the Lord in prayer and be renewed and transformed in our Christian discipleship. This is a time to pray with the Lord, listen to the voice from heaven, and to be transformed from within and transformed as a more vibrant faith community. This transformation is to help us come down from the mountain to our everyday life to continue the mission Jesus entrusted to us.

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD



Following the Collect of the Mass, united as an assembly, our focus turns to the Liturgy of the Word. It is centered at the ambo and the Lectionary of readings. The format of a three-year cycle is based on the Gospels; year A from St. Matthew, year B from St. Mark, year C from St. Luke. The Gospel of St. John is used during Lent, Holy Week and Easter each year and part of year B "When Celebrating the Liturgy, the Church proclaims both the Old [Testament] and the New Testament it is proclaiming one and the same mystery of Christ." (LM #5) The Lectionary was revised by decree of Vatican Council II in 1970 to a three-year cycle for Sundays. This arrangement of readings allows us to hear nearly 60% of the New Testament and 4% of the Old Testament at Mass. Many Christian Churches follow this Lectionary with only minor adaptations, a great contribution to Christian Unity.

The First Reading

The First Readings are usually from the Old Testament. On the Sundays of the Easter Season the First Reading is from the Acts of the Apostles reflecting on the life of the early Church, its witnesses, and its growth.

The Responsorial Psalm

The Responsorial Psalm is the assembly's response in song to the First Reading. The Church has used the Psalms in liturgy and prayer since the time of the Apostles. Jesus would have been very familiar with the Psalms, as much as any devout Jew of his day. The Psalms are God's Word and always meant to be sung.

The Second Reading

The Second Readings are letters of the Apostles to the early Christian communities closely related to the Gospel Reading.

The Gospel Acclamation

This is a joy-filled expression announcing the proclamation of the Gospel Reading. The "Alleluia" which accompanies the Gospel procession, comes from the Hebrew word meaning "Praise God." The entire assembly rises to praise God the Son who comes to announce the Good News of our salvation. During Lent, we fast from the word "Alleluia" and incorporate other acclamations of praise.

The Gospel Reading

The Gospel is proclaimed from the Book of the Gospels rather than the Lectionary. The Gospel is the highlight of the Liturgy of the Word, these are the words and deeds of Jesus. The Book of the Gospels was carried in during the entrance procession and placed on the altar, the seat of all grace and blessings that flow from God the Father through his son, Jesus Christ. This reading is surrounded by many distinct acts of respect; we stand eager to listen, we lift the Book of the Gospels high for all to see, and for great feasts we use candles and incense. A lector and cantor proclaim the other readings, the deacon proclaims the Gospel as a special witness of service to the Church. Only in the absence of a deacon does the priest proclaim the Gospel. The deacon introduces the Gospel reading by making a small cross with his thumb, first on the words of the Gospel reading, then a cross on his forehead, lips and heart. We do the same, as we all silently pray together; "Lord, be in my mind, on my lips, and in my heart."

The Homily

The Homily is a significant part of the Liturgy of the Word, a continuation of God's saving message, which nourishes faith and conversion. It is a way of applying the Word of God to our daily lives.

The Profession of Faith

In the Profession of Faith, the gathered community joins itself with centuries of ancestors who have spoken this affirmation of what we believe. The two creeds are used by the church, first the preferred Nicene Creed from the Council of Nicaea in 325 which settled early disputes around our basic beliefs and the Apostles Creed.

The Universal Prayer

These invocations gather all the prayers of the assembly. Each week we pray for our immediate needs and remember the sick and the dead. They become part of the offerings the assembly makes to God as we next move into the Eucharist.


