On the recommendation of the buildings and grounds committee and our parish leadership, we are planning to start the work which will cost us approximately \$150,000. We will use our reserves to start this work at the earliest, but we may not be able to accomplish it without your support. Therefore, I humbly request that you who are able to support this project be generous.

We are also planning our Parish Mission on March 28, 29, and 30 in the evenings to help us enter into the celebration of the Holy Week and Easter. Let us come together as a community to renew our faith and celebrate this year's Easter more meaningfully.

Placing each one of you and your families into the care and protection of our Mother of Perpetual Help and wishing you a spirit-filled Lenten season.
