Help our parish to be an instrument in the hands of God


Unite and guide us as people of Faith, to become more like Jesus.

We are two weeks into the third and final trimester and had 31 students come back to in person learning for the remainder of the year. We couldn't be more excited to have them back, for several reasons. First, we know that 'in person' learning is what is best for students and we have already seen an increase in engagement and work completion of those students. Second, it is a reminder, albeit subtle, that we are returning to some normalcy. The class pods are slightly bigger and more reflective of full capacity, the students have the opportunity to socialize with their peers and the teachers get to teach more 'in person' learners than online learners. Lastly, it reinforces that our safety protocols are working. To date this year, we have not had ANY student cases in the school. It bodes well for a full return to a 'normal' year in the fall! With that, we are still taking applications for new students and are especially interested in growing our early childhood grades of K3 – K5. Please be sure to mention our school to parents looking for a loving, nurturing and faith-filled community. They may contact the main office to get more information and begin the registration process.
