



Reflections from Fr. Matthew

Returnto the Love of the Merciful Father

The parable Jesus tells in today's Gospel is unique to the Gospel of Luke. Jesus has been teaching the crowds as he journeys to Jerusalem. Today we hear the third of three parables that Jesus tells in response to his critics who were complaining that Jesus befriends sinners. These three familiar parables—the lost sheep, the lost coin, and today's parable of the prodigal son—invite us to consider the depth of God's mercy and love. Much to the displeasure of the Pharisees, Jesus reaches out to sinners while they are still sinners, inviting them to conversion through fellowship with him. Jesus is God acting among us; by befriending us, he is inviting us to return to friendship with God. Through friendship with Jesus, our sins are forgiven and we, in turn, bear fruit for God. Recall last Sunday's Gospel and the barren fig tree.

The story invites us to reflect on three characters: Prodigal son, Loving father and the Unhappy older son. All of us can identify ourselves with each of these characters in our lives.

The younger son takes his inheritance and leaves home. Having been disgraced by the younger son, the father spends time watching the road for the return of the lost son. When he eventually sees his wayward son returning, the father not only welcomes him but also runs out to greet him and then honors him with a party. We say that this father is loving and forgiving. Yet these adjectives only begin to describe the depth of love and mercy that characterize the father. This is why this parable is rightly called by some as the **"parable of the prodigal father"**.

The parable also focuses on the older son, to whom many of us may identify. We find no surprise in the anger of the older son. The father is filled with gratitude and love for the older son's faithfulness. This love is in no way diminished by the father's rejoicing at the return of the younger son. Yet the older son's jealousy reveals his limited understanding of the depth of his father's love and his inability to forgive his brother and celebrate his home coming.

The Fourth Sunday of Lent is traditionally called Laetare Sunday. "Laetare" is a Latin word that means "rejoice." Today's Gospel describes the reason for our joy: God's great love for us has been revealed in Jesus. Through his Passion, Death, and Resurrection, Christ has reconciled us with God and one another. Let us return to him through the Sacrament of Confession during this Lent and enjoy his friendship once again.



THE MASS

THE LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST

The Church understands the Mass to be the living out of the sacrifice of the cross. The priest, standing in the place of Christ *(in persona Christi)* and offering sacrifice in the name of the people gathered, joins himself and the assembly in the action of Jesus' sacrifice of our redemption. The entire Church, in heaven and on earth join their hearts and minds as one in the sacrifice of Christ for our redemption. Jesus gives his all so that we might live with him for all eternity. The Liturgy of the Eucharist contains elements of two ancient Hebrew traditions, the ritual meal in the breaking of the bread, which Jesus left as his memorial, and the temple tradition of sacrifice offered to God. These two elements weave together in the symbolic actions and prayers of the Eucharist.



The Preface

This prayer of thanksgiving and praise to God the Father for his gifts of creation and redemption introduces the Eucharistic Prayer and unites us with the "Angels and Archangels, with Thrones and Dominions and with all of the Powers of heaven" with our response of praise from the Prophet of Isaiah, "Holy, Holy, Holy, Lord God of Hosts." known as **The Preface Acclamation**.

The Eucharistic Prayer (Roman Canon)

There are several versions of the Eucharistic Prayer for various needs of the Church during various times of the year, all based on the original Roman Canon. This prayer has remained basically the same since the 6th century as a prayer of worship, thanksgiving and sanctification. We pray for the pope, our bishops, and all the members of the Church on earth and in heaven. Here we ask Our Mother Mary and all the saints of heaven to be united with us in prayer.

With hands outstretched over the bread and wine, the priest calls upon the Holy Spirit over our offerings and to accept the gifts and prayers we have placed on the altar, that will become our spiritual food.

The words of institution are taken from the accounts of the Last Supper in Sacred Scripture. As the priest raises the bread and then the chalice of wine, we are called to enter into the mystery of Christ who is now upon the altar in the humble form of bread and wine. We now participate in what Jesus asked of us, to "Do this in memory of me." (RM # 90)

The Mystery of Faith is the recognition of Christ's three-fold action of death, resurrection, and his triumphal return. God is ever faithful to his covenant in the power of Jesus Christ fulfilled in our presence upon the altar! We celebrate all that Christ did and continues to do for us. Our prayer at each Eucharist is for the unity that comes through reconciliation by the offering of all of us to the Father with and through Christ.

Following the acclamation, the priest continues the prayer in union with the entire Church on earth and in heaven. The angels of heaven, the Apostles and Martyrs are invoked to be united with us in prayer and worship. The Eucharistic Prayer is concluded with the doxology, followed by the affirmation of the assembly with **The Great Amen**!


Church is secured with a keypad entry after 1:00 PM daily. We are currently in need of additional adorers - "Can you spend 1 hour with our Lord?"
