Parish Office

Our drop slot is located on the brown employee entrance for contributions or anything else you may need to drop off. We will continue to serve you as best we can during this time of isolation.

Mass and Prayer Services

Here are a few details you should know:

1. Fr. Jeff & Fr. Thomas continue to offer Mass privately each day, keeping all parishioners and their intentions in prayer. Mass intentions are prayed for as scheduled.
2. Mary Maberry, Pastoral Council Chairperson, has invited the parishioners and community at-large to collectively join in prayer from the comfort & safety of home. All are encouraged to pray the rosary or any form of prayer every Tuesday evening beginning at 7 pm for the parish, community, country, and world during the Covid-19 pandemic.
3. The Church Spaces and Adoration Chapel are now **CLOSED** until further notice, in keeping with all health directives.
4. The Archbishop sent to all the parishes the difficult news that all parishes are to cancel Palm Sunday and Holy Week masses. While we are so sad to hear this news, it is understandable. We will continue uploading videos to our website including the rosary and the upcoming weekend masses for you to view and participate at home.
5. The 106th Street Site will be open beginning Monday, March 30th between the hours of 8 am until 12 noon for private, individual prayer time. Please enter the West doors and be seated in the two designated sections on the Lincoln Street side only. Please remember to practice social distancing - there can be **NO MORE THAN 10** People in the church at any given time.
6. There will be individual confessions offered Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays from 11 am until 12 noon at our 106th Street site.
